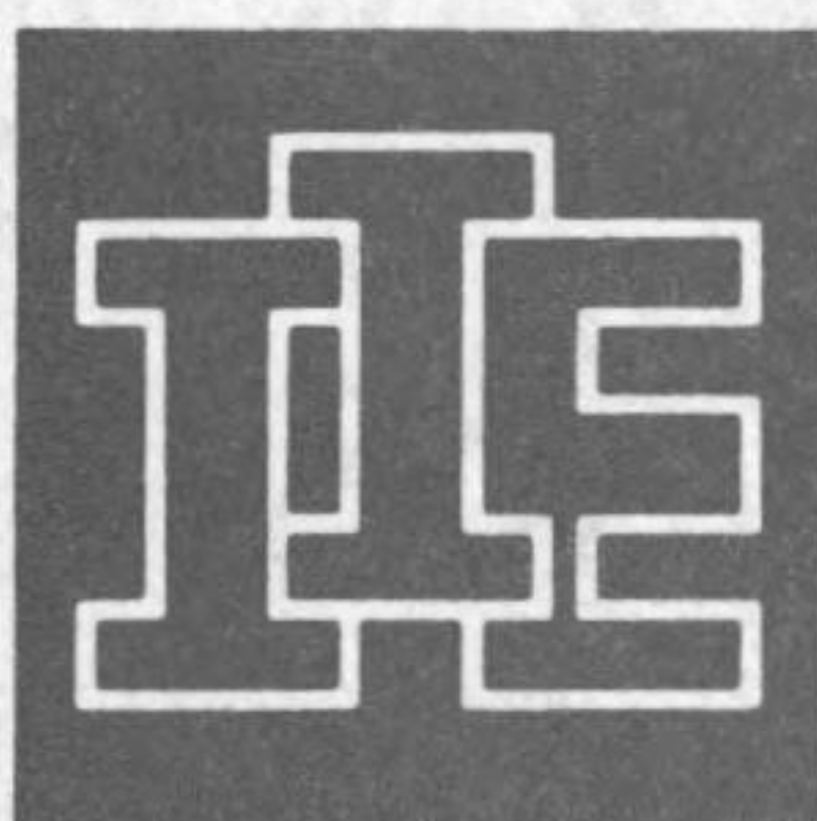

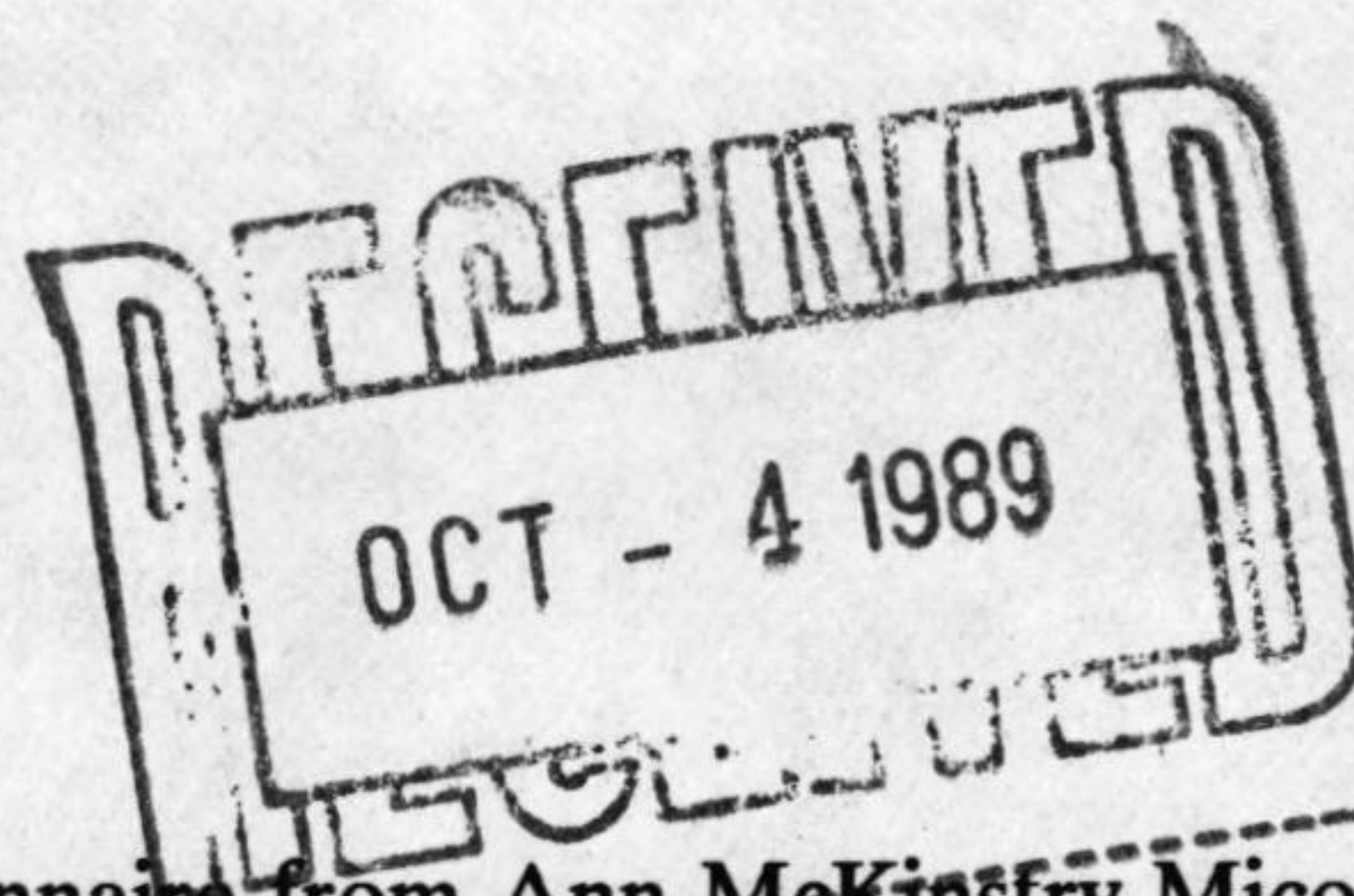

Dear Dan:

Last spring you were mailed a letter and questionnaire from Ann McKinsry Micou, director of The South African Information Exchange (SAIE), concerning assistance to South African exiles and refugees.

As noted in the letter, one of the main functions of the SAIE, which is sponsored by the New York-based Institute of International Education -- the oldest and largest private international exchange organization in the United States -- and funded by the Ford Foundation and the Carnegie Corporation of New York, is to publish information on existing or potential resources to sponsor or implement initiatives related to change in South Africa. The purpose of the SAIE is not only to share information but to promote networking and coordination and to reduce duplication and overlap.


The SAIE has completed a number of surveys concerned with South Africa-related funders in the United States -- for example, foundations, professional associations, colleges and universities, corporations, U.S.-related corporate trusts operating in South Africa, and U.S. support organizations raising money for South African causes.

This new survey will look at ways to meet the critical needs of those South Africans who are currently not able to live inside their country. The purpose of this publication is to provide a brief reference guide to five types of organizations concerned with South African exiles and refugees -- those *granting support* to organizations implementing programs, those *granting support and implementing programs themselves*, those *seeking support* to implement programs, those assisting organizations and individuals in *locating support*, and those *providing analysis/advocacy/public information*.

Because some confusion arose as to the exact purpose of this latest publication, I am sending you a revised questionnaire and a draft that provides an outline of what the proposed working paper will contain. The paper will try to define the universe of international organizations assisting South African exiles and refugees and is designed, not to inundate funding sources nor to raise false expectations, but as a reference guide to help you in your work.

Please fill out and return the enclosed questionnaire. After we have completed a draft, we will send you a copy for any changes and your final approval. Thank you very much for your help in this project.
