

THE UNIVERSITY OF ZAMBIAGENERAL ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSIONA. ADMISSION TO FIRST DEGREE COURSES

Note: Throughout these Requirements for admission to courses of study, references to a pass or passes at ordinary level of the General Certificate of Education means the attainment of Grade A, B, or C in the examination result.

1. Any person shall be eligible for any course leading to a first degree in the University if he:

(a) satisfies the General Entrance Requirements of the University, unless granted exemption under relevant University Regulations;

(b) satisfies all the requirements prescribed by Regulations specified in Section II of the General Academic Regulations of the University of Zambia, relating to the relevant School or Board of Studies as being necessary for such a course of study; and

(c) has been selected for such a course of study.

1.1 IT MUST BE EMPHASIZED THAT ADMISSION TO THE UNIVERSITY IS BY SELECTION AND POSSESSION OF THE MINIMUM ENTRY REQUIREMENTS IS NOT OF ITSELF A GUARANTEE OF ACCEPTANCE

1.2 THE GENERAL ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

(a) Standard Qualifications

(i) passes in at least five subjects at the General Certificate of Education Ordinary level  
or

(ii) credit passes in at least five subjects at Cambridge Overseas School Certificate.

The subjects must be chosen from an approved list, and there are restrictions that forbid the inclusion of overlapping subjects. The subjects at present approved are listed in Section 1.4 of these Requirements.

At the General Certificate of Education Ordinary level examination from June, 1975 onwards a result of Grade A, B, or C will be regarded as a 'pass' for the satisfaction of Requirements.



(b) Alternative Qualifications

(i) Qualifications other than those of the General Certificate of Education or the Cambridge Overseas School Certificate may be accepted provided they are approved as equivalent by the Senate.

(ii) A person holding a two-year diploma of the University or a college awarding the diploma in special relationship with the University may be regarded as having satisfied the general entrance requirements.

(c) Exceptions from the Standard or Alternative Qualifications

A candidate who is thirty years of age in the academic year in which he proposes to begin his degree may be admitted to any degree course if he presents evidence of attainments which in the opinion of the University indicates that he has the capacity to pursue the proposed Course of Study.

- 1.5 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary the Senate in special cases, may declare any person eligible for admission to any course of study for a degree in the University although he has not complied with the foregoing provisions of Section 1.3 hereof, and in so doing may provide such conditions whether in relation to completion of qualifications ordinarily required for admission or otherwise as the Senate may determine.

## 2. ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO DIPLOMA COURSES

### 2.1 Diploma in Library Studies

Duration: Two Years

#### Minimum Academic Qualifications

To qualify for admission, a candidate must have attained the following:-

- (a) Four acceptable G.C.E. 'O' level passes gained concurrently
- (b) Five acceptable G.C.E. 'O' level passes gained consecutively.

In each case one of the G.C.E. 'O' Level Passes must be in English Language

- (c) In addition to the above, a candidate must have had a Minimum of one year's Library experience prior to being admitted into the Diploma programme.



2.2 Diploma in Social Work

Duration: Three Years

(a) Minimum Academic Qualifications

Five passes at Cambridge School Certificate level of which three should be at credit level.

or G.C.E. equivalent of these:

The 3 credit level passes should include English Language.

(b) Personal Statement (not more than 300 words)

Choice of candidates would be made by departmental recommendation on the basis of the personal statement from the applicants who are minimally academically qualified.

2.3 Diploma in Teacher Education

Duration: Two Years

To qualify for admission, candidates must be qualified primary School teachers with at least five years experience. They must also have a minimum of four 'O' level passes. Mature Age Entry Scheme will not apply.

2.4 Diploma in Adult Education

Duration: One Year

To qualify for admission, candidates must have the certificate in Adult Education of the University of Zambia or equivalent. Mature Age Scheme will not apply.

2.5 Diploma in Nursing Education

Duration: Two Years

To qualify for admission, candidates must fulfill the following requirements:

- (a) Pass in FIVE subjects at ordinary level or an approved equivalent. (In exceptional cases candidates who do not satisfy this requirement may be considered under the terms of the University's Mature Age Admission).
- (b) Certificate of registration as a Nurse: S.R.N. for Zambian residents or an equivalent qualification.
- (c) A record of good performance in Nursing and satisfactory reference from at least two persons, one of whom must be a recent supervisor of the candidate.



- (d) Two years experience as a registered Nurse.

### 3. ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO CERTIFICATE COURSES

#### 3.1 Certificate in Adult Education

Duration: One Year

To qualify for admission, candidates must have three acceptable G.C.E. 'O' level passes or three acceptable Cambridge Overseas School Certificate Credits, or other qualifications deemed by the University to be equivalent to the above.

In addition, candidates should also have at least one year relevant experience.

#### 3.2 Certificate in Public Health Nursing

Duration: One Year

To qualify for admission, candidates must be in possession of the following:

- (a) Pass in FIVE subjects at Ordinary level or an approved equivalent. (In exceptional cases candidates who do not satisfy this requirement may be considered under the terms of the University's Mature Age Admission).
- (b) Certificate of registration as a Nurse S.R.N. for Zambian residents or an equivalent qualification.
- (c) A record of good performance in Nursing and satisfactory reference from at least two persons, one of whom must be a recent supervisor of the candidate.
- (d) Two years experience as a registered Nurse.
- (e) Certificate of registration as a Midwife: S.R.M. for Zambian residents or an equivalent qualification.

NOTES ON COMPLETING APPLICATION FORMS FOR NON-SCHOOL LEAVERS

1. GENERAL:
- (a) Both forms (white and pink) must be filled in completely. Incomplete forms WILL NOT BE ACKNOWLEDGED OR PROCESSED.
  - (b) Nothing should be written in the space marked "FOR OFFICE USE ONLY."
  - (c) Admission to the University is by selection based on the quality of grades in best five acceptable subjects and subject combination. Therefore possession of the general entry requirements is not, of itself, a guarantee of acceptance.
  - (d) Choice of courses must be made only from the courses listed in part III below.
  - (e) There are very few places (not more than ten (10) offered to non-school leavers on the Diploma in Social Work. Generally, there are comparatively few places offered for all Diploma and Certificate courses.
  - (f) If you have a physical disability or handicap, you must write to the Registrar and attach the letter to the forms, stating the courses in which you are interested and the nature of your disability.
  - (g) All completed forms must be received by the Registrar (Admissions) by not later than 29th December, 1978.
  - (h) All forms must be accompanied by a five kwacha (K5.00) non-refundable application fee in Zambian Postal or Money Order, or International Money Order. Cash and cheques are not acceptable.

NB The MAE Scheme will only apply to those who are 30 years and above and who do not have the minimum entry requirements (i.e. 5 acceptable 'O' level passes or UNZA/Nkrumah Copperbelt Teachers Diploma). It does not also apply to former degree UNZA students. The scheme may not also apply to those seeking admission to Natural Sciences based schools.

13. Write the study programme (i.e. full-time, part-time, etc.) you wish to follow in the space provided. Separate forms may be submitted for each programme. Registration in part-time programme involves attendance at lectures at the same time as full-time students. The difference between part-time students and full-time students is that part-time students can register for only two courses in any year. They are not given University accommodation. Correspondence study may not normally be available to Lusaka residents.

**NOTE** There is no direct entrance to the schools of Agricultural Sciences, Engineering, Law, Medicine and Mining at first year level. Therefore persons wishing to read for degrees in the schools of Agricultural Science, Engineering, Medicine



and Mining will have to do first year in the School of Natural Sciences. Those intending to do Law will have to do first year in the School of Humanities and Social Sciences. There is direct admission to the School of Education.

#### IV MATURE AGE ENTRY

If you wish to be considered under the MAE Scheme you must write (like all other candidates) your name and address on the back of the acknowledgement card enclosed. If you have been entered for MAE examinations, your examination centre will be entered on the card in the space provided.

On receipt of the card you should register with the UNZA Resident Tutor of your province (or Chief Education Officer for Mans Centre). Registration for the examination will only be accepted on production of the card.

The Resident Tutor of your centre will inform you of the examination date when this is known. The examination is, however, not likely to be held before March, 1979.

If you want to change your centre, you should apply to your Resident Tutor indicating reasons why you want to change, the centre you want to register for and your application number. The Resident Tutor will inform you whether or not your request for change has been accepted.

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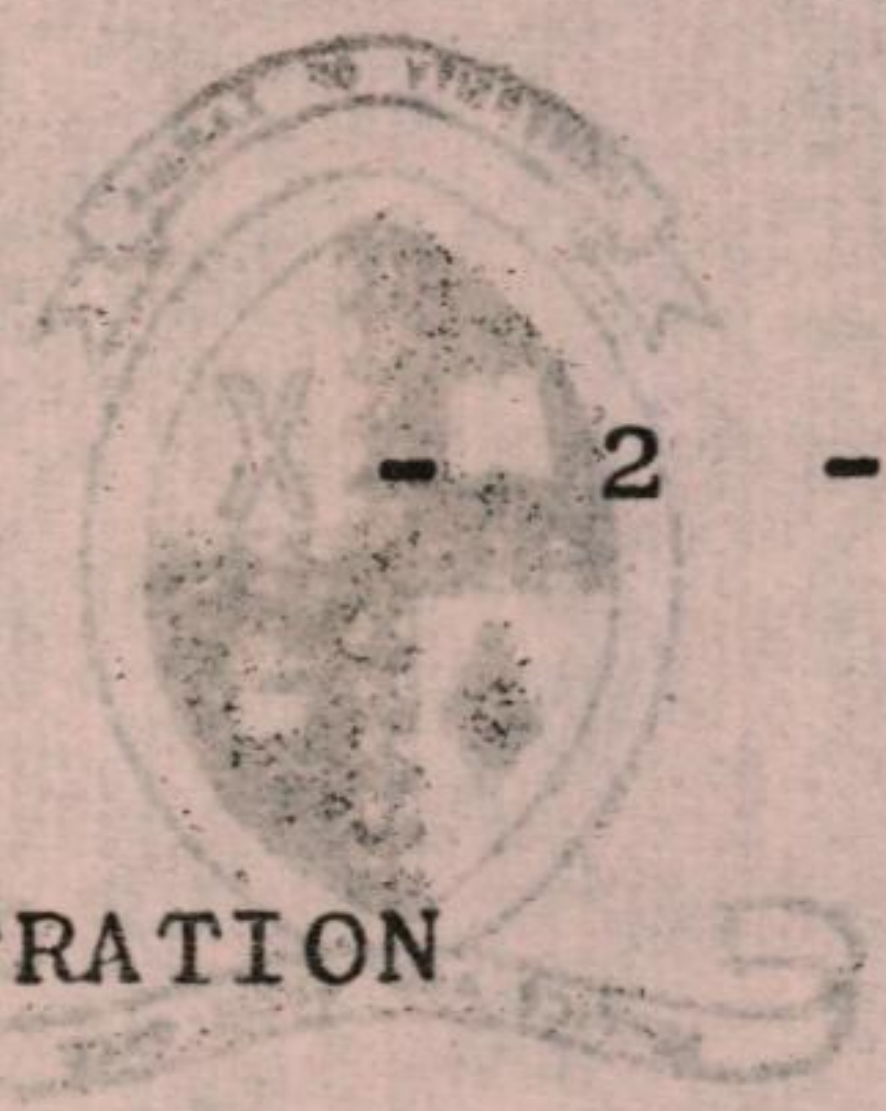
