Birst let me thank you very much for the efforts already made in trying to solve the problem of Mhlekazi's diet.

The arrangement to send vegetables weekly from Head Office came at a time when we were in the mist of a crisis.

Though we have been e exppiriencing serious shortages of vegetables in the past this year has been excceptionally dry with the result that vegetable production totally stppped.

Your recommendation that things like drinks should be bought from Swaziland is definately what we could be doing if possible.

The courrier system we are using to get things from Swazilanf is very much irregular and unriliable, but in the absence of any other method we use it.

Some times we do find things like drinks from Interfranca (local shop) though their supply is limitted.

With regards meat supplies we always make sure that preference is given to people like him, unless there is a serious crisis.

I think for future consideration I must also raise problems of cases similar to that one of Mhlekazi.

We have here most of the Cdes like Moses Mabhida and Themba. These two comrades have the same problem of getting enough vegetables We are promising to do our best inspite of the little problems I have pointed out.
