PEACE WAVE WILL SOON START FROM HIROSHIMA, NAGASAKI AND THE REST OF JAPAN - LIST OF PLANNED ACTIONS IN MAJOR JAPANESE CITIES

Coming close to the start of the 2nd "Peace Wave", Thursday, June 9, and its major action day, June 11, Japanese grass-roots groups are now at the final stage of preparation for their actions. The SSDIII Japanese Liaison Committee Delegates, totaling some 320 people, have already left for New York carrying the "Hiroshima-Nagasaki Flame", signatures of 240,788 people sent to us from 132 countries as well as messages of Japanese local leaders representing over 29 million signers of the "Appeal", all to be submitted to SSDIII. Set out below is the list of actions to be held in major Japanese prefectures and cities in the 2nd P.W.

JUNE 9 (Thursday): On this first day of the 2nd P.W., there will be door-to-door and street signature campaigns in all 47 prefectures.

HIROSHIMA

At noon, the Peace Wave Initiation
Rally will start at the City's Peace
Memorial Park. Simultaneously with the
firework and multi-colored balloons
released from the park, over 500 temples
and churches will ring their bells around
the city to announce the P.W. start.
Hiroshima peace groups will then launch
Street and door-to-door signature campaign
in all districts of the city.

NAGASAKI

As in Hiroshima, there will be fireworks, balloon-release and peace-bells from churches and Buddhist temples at noon. The P.W. Initiation Rally will start from 11 o'clock at Peace Park. At 1 pm a simultaneous signature drive will be launched in commercial centers and residential areas.

TOKYO

Along with the signature campaign for

the "Appeal", there will be many varieties of actions in all the 23 wards and 31 municipalities of Metropolitan Tokyo. The list of June 9 events includes: "Hiroshima-Nagasaki Flame" parade (Katsushika-ward), P.W. music festival (Kita-ward), march surrounding the Defense Agency (Shibuya-ward), paper-lantern parade (Koganei), citizen concert (Kunitachi).

HOKKAIDO

A peace march starting from 12:15 in Sapporo will be the central event of a prefecture-wide signature drive.

Chiba

In the square of Chiba city's central station, Japanese traditional drums will sound at noon, with a photo-panel exhibition display and song and music performance. Simultaneously, the signature campaign will start in 30 cities, towns and villages of the prefecture. On June 10, Chiba-city peace workers will move into all residential areas for a door-to-door signature drive with the goal of collecting signatures from 50 % of the city's total population.

Aichi

In solidarity with the 1988 Tokyo-Hiroshima Peace March passing through Nagoya on June 8, peace workers will start the signature campaign in all cities of the prefecture.

JUNE 11 (Saturday):

On this major action day, the start of nation-wide action will be announced in the "Peace Wave Central Plaza" set up at Yamate-church, Tokyo. Actions will take place at thousands of places throughout the country. P.W. Cessna planes will fly in Osaka and some other parts of the country to announce the start of the major action.

TOKYO

Along with varieties of actions in every administrative area, there will be a 24-hour program in the "P.W. Central Plaza". The initiation ceremony will start from noon on June 11 with church-bells ringing and thousands of balloons being released in front of the Yamate church. Some other events in the "P.W. Central Plaza" are: P.W. concert from 4 pm, P.W. youth festival from 9 pm till 6 am on June 12, P.W. interfaith service on the morning of June 12 and concluding rally at noon on June 12. Information on world-wide and nation-wide P.W. actions will be provided between programs.

Osaka

Osaka prefectural and city governments offices will be surrounded at noon by peace workers and citizens demanding the adoption of a nuclear-free declaration. From the morning, two Cessna planes will fly to announce the start of the mojor day actions. A door-to-door signature campaign will be organized in every administrative area.

HAKODATE-HOKKAIDO

A "P.W. tram" will run throughout the city on that day. There will be "P.W. Yachts" in the port, "P.W. kite flying" by students in junior and senior high, "P.W. peace bells" from churches and temples and "P.W. Human Letters" spelled out on Mt. Hakodate. On June 12, the door-to-door signature campaign will take place in all city districts.

NAGOYA

From June 11 to 12, along with the street and door-to-door signature

campaign, there will be a peace march and rally (June 12), photo panel exhibition, anti-nuclear concert, Hiroshima-Nagasaki Flame concert, Hand-made goods bazaar and many other events throughout the city.

HIROSHIMA & NAGASAKI

In Hiroshima, the goal of collecting signatures from 50 % of local population will be reached in Hiroshima, Mihara, Onomichi and Fukuyam, major cities of the prefecture by June 12. In Nagasaki, the prefectural goal of 50 % will be reached by June 12.

NATIONAL ORAGANIZATIONS:

Some 1,200 prominent persons and leaders of various social movements have expressed their support for the 2nd P.W. An appeal has been issued in many social sectors, calling for active participation in the P.W., such as one published jointly by Mr. Kaoru Ota, former chairman of the General Council of Trade Unions (Sohyo), Mr. Satoshi Roppongi, former chairman of the National Railways Trade Union and many other trade union leaders. The two national religionists organizations, NGO Religionists Committee and Religious Peace Conference, are calling on Buddhist temples and churches throughout the country to ring their bells for the P.W. to start. Doctors, nurses and staff of the State-run hospitals, Red Cross, Health Insurance Hospitals will organize P.W. actions in their hospitals from June 9 to 12. Taxi drivers will again run P.W. taxis, placing "P.W. Action for the Abolition of Nukes" stickers on their cars.
