## Foreword

A great tragedy happend in the prisons of Iran after J uly 1988. The regime of Islamic Republic massacred Iranian political prisoners in such dimensions that was described by the Amnesty International (AI) as incomparable in the 1980s (AI, London, Dec 13, 1988.)

Due to the reign of terror and suppression in Iran, it is very hard to obtain information on executions. The legal mass media in Iran has not published a bit of news on this matter. However, certain statements by the leaders of the regime are evidences of the regimes admitting to this great crime. For example, in an interview on Dec. 10, 1988, Moumvi Ardebili, the chief of Supreme Court of the Islamic Republic said that the chance of penitence was granted to a number of prisoners who were later executed because they did not use this possibility. EThe interview of state radio on Dec. 10, 1988.

Independent reports on the number of victims of mass executions in the second ha" of 1988 mainly amount to several thousands. The victims were affiliated with different opposition parties.

The representative of the Central Committee of the Organization of Iranian Peol'ilets Fedaian (Majority) in Europe hereby publishes all available information on this matter in order to provide information to the international community and asks all freedom loving personalities, parties, organizations and unions in different countries to use all possible means to organize a protest campaign in accordance with the real dimensions of this tragedy.

These facts are based on extensive information gathering and undeniable documents which may be examined in any detail and verified by any authorized international body or court of law. The names of over 600 victims is also available as an undeniable evidence.

## Background

The Islamic Republic regime has used the execution of opponents from the very first months of Ruhotiah Khomeini's coming to power in 1979 to establish and strengthen power. Tens of Kurdish movement activists for local self government were executed in August 1979. The Islamic Republic regime probably had not yet realized the need for covering up such mass executions or could not manage to effectively control the mass media. This led to the publication and broadcasting of the shocking pictures of execution scenes in Kurdistan. These pictures served as documents of the savagery of the regime in the eyes of international community.

The execution of political prisoners reached horrible dimensions in June 1981. The regime exploited the armed conflicts with the Organization of Peoplefs Mojahedin of 1ran,(OPM1), as an opportunity to physically annihilate all political opponents. A horrible wave of terror reigned the country for several months. One can recall certain days on which the regimes radio reported hundreds of executions with the names of victims. Picking up a leaflet in anti-government demonstrations or even being arrested while accidentally walking through the area was enough to be executed after a "trial" that would not last longer than a few minutes. In some cases the. victim was killed on the scene without such a utrial. The majority of victims belonged to the. OPMI, but many activists of the let t forces were also executed. Later the OPMI published a list of 10,000 names who were victims of this vawe of terror. This list contains first and last names of victims together with the date and place of executions which can be examined. The collectors of these names believed that the actual number of executions reached several times of the names available on the list.

lixewution for political ends in the Islamic Republic of Iran has never stopped since then. Some of these executions have been announced by the regime. in other cases, only the families of victims were notified. All the victims were severely tortured, which is also true for other politkal prisoners. Torture in the prisons of Iran is not only time

ticeri for information collecting, but also as a mean to force the prisoner to denounce his/her positions and beliefs in front of TV cameras. Such disgusting video programs are not rare on the Islamic Republics state TV.

In spite of torture and intolerable pressures on political prisoners, which has repeated. ly been reported by the UN Human Rights Commission and the Amnesty International, the resistance of political prisoners bagan to gain momentum from 1987 on. Political prisoners resisted pressures and shortcomings by several hunger strikes in different prisons, particularly in Tehran. This resistance forced certain limited retreats upon the regime. The existance of several thousand political prisoners who had not denounced their positions, was regarded by the regime as a serious problem. Evidences exist that prove the regimes preparation in 1987 for the "final solutionit of this problem in the most appropriate time

The execution of Anoushirvan Lotti, a leadership member of the OIPF(Majority), together with three other political prisoners was announced by the regime in June 1988.

IAI, London, 1&3, 1988.1Soon another group of political prisoners were executed in Tehran with only their families being notified by the regime Heavy armed conflicts happened in the western region of the country during the last days of Iran-Iraq war in late J uly 1988. The regime exploited the coincidence of militar

operations of OPMI with these developments in the western region as a pretext to publicly hang numerous opponents in several cities. The official media in Iran reported this savagery.

At the mme time, prison officials told the families of political prisoners, who had come to visit their loved ones on the regular time table, that visits were postponed for an indefinit time. The families did not receive any information on their loved ones for four months. This was a serious alarm in itself; but it was coupled with the fact that in the uMarxist prisoners sectionii of a number of cemetaries, particularly the Khavaran cemetary in the eastern part of Tehran, mass graves were being diggecl. W itntsses have reported that about 300 prisoners are buried in two parallel long mass graves in the Khavaran cemetary. Later information verified all concerns.

The UN Human Rights Commission condemned mass execution of Iranian political prisoners in early November 1988. iUNtHRC, Nov. 3, 1988.1 The statement indicates that the new wave of execution of opponents of the regime has started short before the cease fire and after it. The statement continues that a large number of political prisoners who were affiliated with different opposition groups, have been executed during the months of July, August and early September. Quoting some opposition forties, the statement reported the number of executions to be 1140.

Mr. Reynaldo Galindo Pohl, the special officer of the UN-HRC, indicated in the Nov. 3 statement that the executed prisoners Were severely tortured. He added that many victims were only supporters of opposition forces or simply opposed the current political order.

The Amnesty International released an statement at the time, expressing its concern about the dimensions of genocide in the Iranian prisons.

Every thing was finally proved to be corect when the families of hundreds of politi-(al prisoners were informed by the regime in the second half of November 1988 that their loved ones had been executed. These families, after months of repeated approaches to visit their loved ones, finally received the packs of the victims' personal belongings

Only in limited cases one could also find a testament. In most cases the families were not informed of the place of victims, graves. In some cases the families were forced to "bail 011? the personal belongings of the victims or leave cash deposits to make sure that they would not observe normal mourning ceremonies.

Following the receive of these horrible reports, our organization decided to collect as many names of victims as possible. Our list currently contains over 600 names. Based on verified reports, executions were carried out in almost all the cities in which politi

cal prisoners were kept, but our list principally contains the names of victims who were executed in Tehran and a few other cities. It should also be taken into account that many families do not have any possibility to report the execution of their loved ones due to the intensive suppression and terror that reigns the country. The Amnesty International, while reporting the new wave of executions in Iran in an statement in late November, reported that the executions included opponents of the

an statement in late November, reported that the executions included opponents of the regime belonging to different groups and many had, in fact, been tried and received terms of imprisonment whois punishments were later elevated to execution. The statement continues that it is in clear contrast to the Universal Charter of Human Rights, of which Iran herself is a cosigner. The Charter considers the re-trying and re-punishment of someone for a closed case to be a violation of human rights.

Reports of executions have been received from the prisons in many cities, however, no one knows the actual number of victims. Someone called Karbelaee, who is respon-

sible for com reation with the families of prisoners in the Evin prison of Tehran, Qid: uWe have cleared and washed up three sections which contained 1200 prisoners and we have locked them up? The chiefs of the so called Khavaran Islamic Revolution Committee in eastern Tehran, which supervises the now well known Khavaran cemetary, have told the victims families: uWe have killed 8640 of them because they didntt behave themselves?

The Amnesty International claimed in an statement on Dec. 13, 1988 that hundreds or probably thousands have been executed in Iran. The statement continues that the Iranian officials have carried out the biggest wave of secret executions i or political ends

in the whole decade of 198015. iAl, London, Dec. 13, 1988.1 We have received reports of executions from Tehran, Mashhad, lsfahan, Rasht, Tabriz, Oroumiyyeh, Gachsaran, Hamedan, Alwaz, Arak, Babel, Ghouchan, Sanandej, and many other Cities of Iran.

This picture was taken secretly of a mass grave in the Khavaran cemetary in eastern Tehran which was discovered in late (a ) $Ctobcr\ 1988$ .

## "Board" of genocide!

Verified information obtained through different channels are all in agreement to suggest that Khomeini himself ordered the mass execution of political prisoners. He appointed a uboard" to enforce his order. Evidences indicate that the board bagan to work in midsummer 1988. For example, We have received a report from the Evin Prison in Tehran, indicating that members of the board and their task force entered the prison with three cars several times a Week. Every time they read a list of names and their task force executed the victims. A number of prisoners were hanged in front of the others.

ilhe authorities of the Islamie Republic, who had kept silence for months or even denied the whole matter, were forced to take position after the spread of these news inside and outside of the country. In an interview that was broadcasted by the regime's radio on Dec. 10, 1988, Abdolkarim Mousavi Ardebili, the Islamic Republics chief of Supreme Court said that "a number of executions" had taken place. By saying that the exeurtion of victims was due to their ufailure to use the chance of penitencett and "provmation in itirisorfi, he implicitly acceptal that no court of law had passed the execution sentences. IKeyhan newspaper, Tehran, Dec. 11, 1988.1 llashemi Rafsanjani, the president of Islamic parliament and deputy Chief of corn-

In reaction to the resolution of the UN Human Rights Commission on the Islamic Re; rublic, Mohammad Jalfar Mahallati, the Islamic Republics representative in the UN, fell short of any responce to the eoncret claims proposed by the international community. The W est German weekly Spiegel reported that Iranian authorities responded with contradicting explanations to the questions of foreign minister Hans D. Genscher on the late of Certain '. ictims. ISi'iiegel, Dec. 5, 1988.)

In responce to a question posed to him in Tehran University, Ali Khamenei, president of the Islamic Republic answered: "llave we abolished capital punishment? Like many other countries in the world we have capital punishment. For whom do we have it? For those who deserve it. W hoever commits crimes which deserve execution, will be executed. We have not covered up this action." tResalat newspaper, Tehran, Dee. 7, 1988.)

Who are the victims?

As it is evident from the claims of the Islamic Republic% authorities, the regime is eager in responce to international protest to define all the victims as individuals who were engaged in armed struggle against the regime. Examining the list of victims, whose execution we have verified so far, proves this claim to be a big lie.

Most of the names are listed with party affiliation. As an example, the names of more than 100 cadres and members of the OIPF(Majority) are on the list. A slightly fewer number of members of the TPI are also among the victims. Other left parties such as the OIPF(16th Azar Platform), the OIRW, the OKTI(Komele) and the OIPFG(Minority) also lost a considerable number of their members in the wave of executions. 'lhe KDPI shares the tragedy too.

It should also be taken into account that a great number of executed members of the. OPMI were those who had terms of imprisonment and in contrast to the regimes claims, could not have participated in any military actions; since any sort of involvement in a military operation suffices to lead to death sentence and not imprisonment in the Islamic Republic. It is also true for the great part of those who had no affiliati on

with the OPMI, since they were exhausting their terms of imprisonment. Many of them had already finished their terms of imprisonment and were kept in prison with no ground Nearly all the victims were arrested in 1986 or before.

All these facts, which are supported by undeniable documents, may be verified for a correct judgement of international opinion. These facts prove that even in the framework of medieval laws of the regime of Khomeini one could not find a pretext to mass murder the political prisoners in such shocking dimensions. The Islamic Republics henchmen have. committed this crime not based on their own laws, but a bloody revenge which was decided by the top authorities of the regime.

Each case

a tragedy by itself

Facts and figures only define the dimension of this genocide that is committed in the Iranian prisons. By considering each victim as the tragic late of a human being and a family, one can feel and grasp the depth of this tragedy.

Consider a mother, who after months of fnistrating worry and receiving contradictory information, finally receives a bundle of clothes and becomes notified that they have killed her daughter or son;

Consider the wife and children of a victim, who have marked the passing of each day with the hope that some day they will have him back in the house; and finally the news of execution of their father and loved one strikes them like a lightening: Consider a family who is first asked to pay a lot of money as the fee for "curing" the prisoner, and after receiving the money they my that the prisoner was in fact executed;

Consider the horrible scene of groups of relatives and families who are gathered to receive some information on the fate of their loved ones and then a list of newly executed victims is cold-bloodedly read to them.

Didlft the humanity concluded after the Natzis that "Never Again!"? Isnlt the most basic human right the right to live? Our broken-hearted and mourning people expect \_the international community to respond and react properly and accordingly to the bloody crime of Khomeini, which may only be compared to Hitler.

Such a tragic genocide in the prisons of the Islamic Republic and its unbelievable dimensions once again showed that international pressure on Khomeini's regime in the past and present never reached the necesmry level. At the same time that political prisoners in Iran were submerged in their blood, foreign politicians were visiting 'l'ehran one after the other to exploit the situation after the end of Iran-lraq war and expand relations with Iran. If an international cooperation for the promotion of human rights in Iran did exist and had reached the level of international cooperation for forcing the regime of Khomeini to end the Gulf war, the tragedy in the lranian prisons would probably have never reached todayts dimensions.

A deserving reaction to the recent shocking crime is to internationalize the human rights issue in Iran. The international community should not respond to such a trampling of internationally accepted norms with mere words of condemnation. At least, relations with the Islamic Republic should be conditioned by other states with the agreement of the regime with an indemndent and international inspection of the case of masmore of Iranian political prisoners.

Currently there are efforts to open the way for the travel of special representative of the UN Human Rights Commission to Tehran. We welcome this trip and are confident that an objective inspection of the ease of recent executions shall definitly find Khomeinfs regime guilty. At the same time, we ask all democratic minded parties, organizations, and individuals to demand their governments to use. any tossibility to provide the following conditions for the visit of international observers:

- 1- The observers must be able to freely visit the relatives of victims in the absence of regimes authorities
- 2- The observers must be allowed to visit all mass graves in different ('emetaties and verify the time of their creation.
- 3. The observers must be able to obtain a list of all political prisoners before the recent executions and after it.
- 4- Reports of observers must be published and broadeasted by the Iranian mass media without any censorship.
- It is clear that mere inspection will not result in anything. The international community should derive practical conclusions from inspections. We believe that such inspections and their consequences will help the progressive forces in Iran to realize democracy and justice in the country and create such conditions that human rights never be trampled again by despotic regimes in Iran.
