#### re: 1987 Graduation Ceremonies

I refer to your letter of 17 November 1987 and our recent telephone discussions regarding your 1987 Graduation Ceremonies. I apologise again for the delay resulting from both of us being on leave.

We have reserved the Sports Centre for you from Monday 30 March 1987. Naturally we have had to cancel on going fixtures and have had to build loss of revenue into this quote.

As agreed you will vacate and clear the Sports Centre by 3pm on Saturday 4th April to allow the Badminton Nationals to commence. We are most grateful for your assistance and compromise with this tricky double booking. The badminton officials have advised that the far left court may be utilised for storage eg Chancellor's chair and shrubbery which may then be cleared on the Monday morning.

I would suggest that we meet at some stage and discuss requirements on site. This would include the positioning of the marquee for which you may require earlier reservation of the Sports field than 3rd April unless the far corner is utilised.

The use of sherry, although not normal YMCA policy, will be acceptable since it is controlled.

Our flat rate for the entire period is R1500 payable within 30 days.

Thank you for your co-operation. We trust that the Graduation will be a great success.

#### SUBJECT: GRADUATION CEREMONIES: 1988: PMB.

- 1. The latest statistics after the audit of the 1987 student data base at the first Tuesday in June reveal that we have 1072 "possible grads" which figure is 110 up on last year.
- 2. Based on calculations over the past few years the following would appear to be a reasonable estimate of the numbers we can expect at graduation in 1988:

#### 1. Background.

- 2. I presume that if aspects such as acoustics, hall capacity, microphones, seating plans, etc. etc. do not concern the Student Affairs Section, then we should concentrate on those that do:
  - 2.1 Recommended Number of Ceremonies :

It is expected that approximately 800 candidates will attend the graduation ceremonies in Pmb. It is therefore recommended that **TWO** ceremonies be scheduled.
