The University of Natal has announced its honorary graduates for 2002. The honoris causa awards will be conferred at the various graduation ceremonies to be held in Pietermaritzburg and Durban during the first semester.

They are:

Prof Ronald Aronson (LLD). Professor of Humanities at Wayne State University, he is a major figure in contemporary scholarship and intellectual life, ranking as the English-speaking world's leading authority on French philosopher Jean-Paul Sartre. Also a leading authority on modern French thought and intellectual life, he has contributed to the understanding and betterment of South African society.

Prof Gert Johannes Gerwel (LLD). Outstanding academic leader, senior government official and executive in parastatals and the private sector

Dr Jane Goodall (DSc). A scientist who has devoted her life to the study of primates in general and chimpanzees in particular, with the majority of her work being Africa-centric. While she has championed the fight to save the world's primate heritage from extinction, her work also has significant implications for the understanding of human evolution.

Prof Bernth Lindfors (DLitt). A scholar with prodigious talent who has assisted in establishing the study of African literature, he is the most prolific and resourceful bibliographer of African Literature in the world.

Dr Nthatho Motlana (LLD). A political leader who made a tremendous contribution to bringing about social justice and democracy in South Africa, he devoted himself to the victims of apartheid and political violence despite difficult circumstances. He is also a committed and excellent medical practitioner, and a businessman of repute.

Prof Amartya Sen (DEcon). Nobel prize winner (Economics), Master of Trinity College, Cambridge University, and Professor Emeritus at Harvard University, he accepted a Doctor of Economics (honoris causa) award in 2001, but was unable to attend last year.

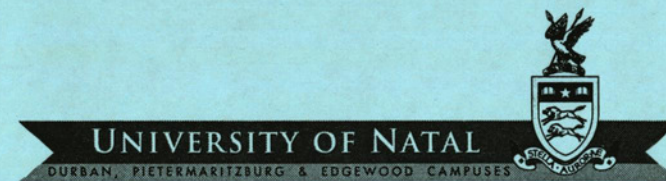
Mr Walter Max Ulyate Sisulu ((LLD). Described as the "moving spirit" behind all the major ANC campaigns of the 1950s, he made a highly tangible and courageous contribution to the success of the South African liberation movement and has demonstrated, throughout his life, an unswerving commitment to the interests of the black majority.

Dr Carolyn Grubbs Williams (DEd). President of the Bronx Community College, a unit of The City University of New York, she has been prominent in the leadership of the American Association of Community Colleges and in other bodies that promote the advancement of minority groups and women in the United States. She has also made a substantial contribution to development in the Pietermaritzburg region.

Prof Muhammad Yunus (DEcon). One-time academic, maverick economist and, as founder and managing director of Bangladesh's Grameen Bank, a peerless visionary and fighter for the eradication of poverty.
