GOPAL MANICUM (Pietermaritzburg & Natal) Captain. Age 27. Right-arm off-spin bowler and useful middle-order batsman. First capped for Natal in 1968.

Captained Natal last season to the Dadabhai Cup first round.

Elected again as this yearâ\200\231s Natal captain.

Best performance \hat{a} 200\224 ~ 7/32 against SWD 1969-70, in Kimberley. - 5/32 v. WP at Cape Town 1971-72.

SEDICK CONRAD (Wynberg and Western Province) Age 27.

Right-handed opening bat. Had a short spell in the Lancashire League in 1968, Has scored 858 runs in only four Dadabhai Cup tournaments.

Best performances $\hat{a}\200\224$ 194vy, Griquas at Durban in 1966 when he also topped the batting averages with 106,00.

scored 418 runs and took 42 wickets. Has scored 710 runs and taken 69 wickets in inter-provincial tournaments.
