The present case load in our region is as follows :-

Out of the total numbet of students studying in local institutions, only fifty- six(56) have sponsorship. This legves twenty four(24) comrades without scholarships. This situation came as a result of UNESCO promise& to give one hundred(100) scholarships to comrades in our region. After experiencing communication problems with UNESCO, Tanzania, two trips were made to Dar-es-Salaam, in order to establish as to whether UNESCO Taxzania would still be in position to sponsor our comrades. It was fortunate for us that our Chief Representative, Cde. Andrew Masondo was one of the people who held disc.ssions over the issue with the Director of UNESCO for East and Southern Africa, D'. Mbengo. It was only after Dr. Mbengo had given us the green light to_ place comzades in schools that we did so. We have since not got communication from UNESCO Tanzania. We have, however, been maintaining the comrades in schools from the South African Extention Unit (SAEU) funds, which has resulted in the postponement of our short-term courses Programme,which was to continue as from July this year.
