dealt with exhausuvely in the undersmding. This document retlects the understanding reached at the conclusion of the discussxons regammg these obstacles and issues. The understandings on ISSUCS and obstacles incluoea the following, although 1t was observe d

mat there are suil other important matters that mil recewe attennon dunng the process of negodauon:

- a) The Government and the ANC agreed that there is a need for a democratic constituent assembly/constitutxon-making body and that for such a body to be democratic it must: I :e cemocratically ejected:
- I draft and adopt the new consumuon. tmpiymg that it should sit as a smgle chamber:
- I be bound only by agrwa consumuonal pnnciples:
- I have a ftxed time frame:
- I have adequate aeanlock breaking mecnamsms:
- I funcuon democmu'caily i.e amve at zts decxsions democraucaily with cenam agrwd to majorities: and
- I be elected within an agreed predetermmcd time period.

:d) The Goldstone Commissmn has ngen further attenuon to hostels and brought out an urgent report on cenam matters and developments in this regard. The Commission indicated that the problem 15 one of commallty and that it Will have to invesugate which localities are affected.

In the meantime some problematic hostels have been identified and the Government has undertaken as a matter of urgency to address and deal with the problem in relation to those hostels that have been assocxated with violence. Further measures will be taken. including fencmg and policing to prevent cominality by hostel dwellers and to protect hostel dwellers against external aggression. A separate document :implemenmon Programme: Hostels) records the idenurication of such hostels and :he secunty measures to be taken in these Instances.

Progress mil be reported to the Goldstone Commtssx'on and the National Peace Secretariat. United Nauons observers may Witness the progress in co-operauon with the Goldstone Commlssmn and the National Peace Secretanat.

- 'e) in the present volatile atmosphere of violence. the public display and carrying or dangerous weapons provokes further tensmn and should be pronibited. The Government has informed the ANC that It mil issue a proclamation within weeks to prombit countryWIde the carrymg and display or. dangerous weapons at all public occasxons subject to exempuons based on gmdelines bemg prepared by the Goldstone Commission. The granung Of exempuons snall be entrusted to one or more reared judges. On this basts, the terms of the proclamauon and mechanism for exemption shall be prepared With the assurance of the Goldstone Commission.
- ,3 The Government acknowledges the right of all parues and orgamsations to participate in peaceful mass acuon in accordance with the provisions of the National Peace Accord and the Goldstone Comnussmnsl recommendations. The ANC for its part reafrirms its commitment to the prowsions of the Code of Conduct for Political Pames amved at under the National Pm Accord and the agreement reached on 16 July 1992 under the ausplices of the Goldstone Commissmn as important instruments 3 ensure democratic political activity in a climate of free political pamctpation. The two pam'es also commit themselves to the strengtheming of the Peace Accord process. to do everything in their power to calm down tensions and to tinding ways and means of promoting reconciliation in South Africa.

The Government, having acceated the Goiostone Commission Report, will fence the following hostels in terms of the oefimtion set out in paragraph 1.1 in annexure "H2" in order to prevent crtmlnality by hostel-dwellers and :0 protect the hostel resments from externat aggression:Mzimhiooe, Dube, Nancetield. Dobsonvile and Merafe (all Situated in

Mzimhiooe, Dube, Nancetield. Dobsonvnle and Merafe (all Situated ir the greater Soweto area).

Madala (snuated in KangO).

c) Seboxeng complex (Sltuated in the :81 area).

The followmg two hostels the KwaZulu. being UmIaZI Section T Unit 17 and Kwa Masnu have been Identified by the ANC as being associated with violence. The Government has undertaken to consult with the Kwa Zulu Government m this regaro.

The measures required to curtail and prevent vuolence and provude greater security to both the hostel dwellers and township dwellers alike have been :oentlfied and defined in annexure "H2".
