- (8) President Nkomo greets members of the National Executive, UNIP and Government Officials.

- (9) President Nkomo is then led by the National Chairman, Comrade S.

 Munodawafa to greet members of the Revolutionary Council, National
 Assembly, Liberation Movements and Diplomats.
- (10) i. The National Chairman welcomes the President.
 - ii. UNIP or Zambian Government Official makes a speech.
- (11) The L.G.M Choir presents a song.
- (12) A gift is presented to President Nkomo by Mai Nyamurowa.
- (13) Comrade President J. M. Nkomo speaks.
- (14) Traditional dances by various groups.
- (15) The National Chairman closes the occasion.
- (16) A song is sung.
- (17) President J. M. Nkomo UNIP and Zambian Government Officials and members of the National Executive leave and are immediately followed by members of the Revolutionary Council, Liberation Movements and Siplomats.
- (18) The rest of the people orderly move out to their transport.
