Reminiscences: 1960-1967

One day in early 1960 when the Adler Fielding Gallery was a mere tin shed on the roof garden of the old Pim's Buildings in Kruis Street ... long since demolished ... a young, shy, very self effacing young African walked timidly into our workshops. He very hesitantly opened thecanvas bag he

was carrying and pulled out two wood carvings of African women.

Lawrence Adler and I were most impressed with the works. We gathered that he had been working at the Polly Street Art Centre under Cecil Skotnes, studying painting, and modelling in clay. He said that he had always wanted to do fine arts, but he was sent by his parents to learn carpentry and Cabinet making. Work in a soap factory and mixing concrete for a builder Followed his carpentry training. Finally he bought some tools and began carving figures out of wood.

Lawrence and I offered him fifteen guineas apiece for the works which he humbly and gladly accepted. We also asked him to bring everything he did to us. The timid young man with the shy smile that we were to know so well was on the road to fame.

Reminiscences: 1960 - 1974

I remember Lucas exhibiting his first sculptures at the Polly Street Exhibition held at Queens Gallery, Johannesburg, in 1960, when his then most important work, a head in indigenous wood, was sold for 40 gns. This "Head" is now valued at 30 times this amount!

Inspite of his success, Lucas has remained Temarkably humble, and generous towards his people. He retains a deep sense of respect for his family and traditions, and has a great understanding of nature, animals and people.
