

" South Africa's most dangerous movement, the banned African National Congress, has moved to new headquarters in London after receiving a huge cash gift from a mysterious source. At least R100,000 is said to be involved and the ANC has used much of the money to purchase a large building which will also be used as a 'reception centre' for Blacks who have run away from SA. The building, which consists of 4 floors and a large basement, is situated near Kings Cross railway station in the working class district of Islington, North London. The basement will house a printing press for various pamphlets and publications of the ANC, the SA Coloured Peoples Party and the SA Indian Congress. A telex machine will also be installed so that the ANC will have speedy contact with its offices in Algiers, America, Mozambique and other parts of Africa. It is believed that the SACTU will be allowed a new office in the new headquarters. Western intelligence experts think that the ANC received the cash gift from Moscow via an iron curtain country..but an official of the Anti-Apartheid Movement has countered this by saying that the money was probably a grant from the OAU's freedom fighting fund. The surprise move, from a small office above a betting shop in Rathbone Place, coincides with the replacement of Mr Reg September as head of the ANC's London office. Mr Yeyedwa Zungu has taken his place and rumour has it that Mr September has been posted to Mozambique where he will join forces with Mr Joe Slovo...who is alleged to mastermind the terrorist attacks against SA from Maputo.

Sources close to the ANC say that the replacement of Mr September is quite in line with the movement's policy of moving its representatives frequently, But SA intelligence analysts strongly doubt this. They point out that Mr September has been in London for nearly 10 years as head of the London office. It is more likely that the move was caused by dissent in the ANC ranks. During the past 3 years several Black ANC members have complained about Mr September...being in charge of the ANC - which they say is supposed to be a 'Black nationalist movement'. At one stage a group of ANC rebels also criticised the fact that Mr September has long been a senior member of the SACP.

The ANC has kept quiet about its new changes. It deliberately shuns publicity in the British press, which it claims 'is 95% capitalist dominated.!....."

" Swapo is intent on sabotaging the West's plans for a peaceful settlement in Namibia, according to documents which security forces say they seized in hot pursuit operations into Angola earlier this year. - \*More than 80% of the guerrillas are illiterate;
- \*discipline is bad amongst the guerrillas;
- \*Swapo does not want any more members of the rival Swanu admitted to the UN Institute for Namibia in Lusaka....."

" Despite the current unfavourable economic climate, efforts to realise the mineral potential in the various homelands continues. Co-ordinated through the Bantu Mining Corporation (BMC), promising platinum deposits have been discovered in Lebowa while in Gazankulu and Venda prospecting for gold, corundum and coal reveal deposits that may yet prove economically viable.....During the past financial year almost R4-m has been spent on 92 mining projects in the homelands, with the greater part of the capital being provided for by the private sector which contributed R3.87-m, and the BMC R668,000. Turnover at the BMC's own ventures reached their highest level, totalling R1.02-m.

Homeland leaders view the exploitation of mineral resources as a sure way of creating more jobs and earning revenue, and especially Lebowa, which has somewhat richer deposits than others and has vigorously encouraged mining activity. Chief Minister of Lebowa, Dr Pathudi, has even engaged an American concern to help with surveys..."
