Ode Percy opened the meeting and said that the manager was going to introduce the new structure after the reports. Ode Maggie was then asked to read the minutes of the last meeting.

Cattle Kraal Ehtfg

On the 23rd of May 2 dairy cows gave birth. The cow which had mastitis was doing MC

well. On Monday supply of feeds for the cows had been sent but the maize was too hard for the cows to chew. But after that fresh one was given which was soft.

12 hyfere which came from Arusha were rather miserable and very thin. Cde Hans

said it was because of their breed that they had been bought. He said they

will be well fed so that they should be able to gain weight. He said still more will be coming.

Goats

One Goat had been affected by mastitis. The wound was healing. Two goats died the blood had been taken for test.

Poultry 4 chicks died of diarrhoea and pens had been cleaned and sprayed. The chicken which had viral pox had been taken back to the bane. Chicks were still healthy so far.

Horticulture

Cde Pule reported that at that time he was still working at the hospital. He said he was still planting trees and flowers. Cde Ebbe was reported sick.

Field Section

Sunflower already been planted in NO 13. On the same field a portion of land

had been used to plant eoya beans but no germination so far. Field no 14 beans had

already been planted and germination was perfect because the seeds were planted

after heavy rainy season. Field No 1 and 9 also germination good Field No 11

grass seeds were planted but no hope of good results. Fresh maize was supplied

all in all 25 bags were delivered to the supplies department for both community

and SOMAFCO. 12 bags were harvested for Dakawa.

Dakawa Germination has not bad but Wziigl there was a problem of grass and if no action

would be taken production will be poor. Cde Hans said arrangements will be done for weeding.

They had decided to send workers to go and inspect the field right inside and they did not find anybody. Therefore they had started supplying maize to the community from the same field.

Hangover

It was reported that six people were required for reinforcement of manpower at the piggery because the work had increased. Cde Hans said some workers could be transferred to the piggery. Cde W4awqdhLeaid he needed some tougher workers who were young and tough not old people and would find it difficult to lift the bags. At the Cattle kraal too some more workers were required for the section.

Cragstore:

It was reported that the grass seeds were finished. It was further reported that 15 bags of beans were in the crapstore. Cde Handle said that the rats had invaded the crapstore. The sunflower seeds had been taken to the silos.

80 bags of mealie-meal were made ready for supply, and the supply people had been informed. One 8110 was still full of maize.

Machinery It was reported that both old and new spare parts were being recorded with their numbers. It was said that most of the names of spare parts were difficult to record unless one was acquainted with the spare parts. Whenever Kombo was not there Gde Raehid said he found it difficult to continue recording spare parts.

43) It was further recorded that the compressor and battery charger had been used. Finally it was emphasised that those working outside the machinery field including Tanzanians were requested not to enter the spare parts store because if anything would disappear then it would be aidi and Cde Rashid who would be blamed.
