Om: organization is the only NGC) having an observer status in the Non Aligned Movement. AAPSO is a solidarity organization "of and for the peoples fOr Africa and Asia" with universal membership, working both in the South for South-South cooperation and in the North for North-South dialogue. THE ADVANCEMENT OF THE SOUTH is the all-embracing goal of AAPSO. that it pursues through the strength of its organization and national committees. With the help of publications, seminars. missions and other activities that arouse public awareness and educate people and Governments alike.

In the different periods there would be different c priorities to be pursued. Born out of the high tide of the national liberation movements and adhering to the Bandung principles, for the past three decades AAPSO made effective contributions to the complete collapse of the old colonial system in Africa, Asia and elsewhere. Our most important goal - the national liberation of the Afro-Asian peoples has been fulfilled. At present AAPSO is active in the struggle against apartheid and for the just settlement of the Middle East conflict. I will just give you some names of other AAPSO's friends that you could meet. and dismiss in detail our relations with the UN. In the UN CENTRE AGAINST APAR'H-IEID - Mr Amer Salih Araim (212 963 5314. room No 8-3577 H) is a close friend of AAPSO. who is always criticizing us for not attending their meetings or even not sending messages on the related solidarity days. In DPI, Mr. Vladimir Lubomudrov, who used to work in AAPSO could be of great help (ext. 3.5455, room No DC 1 - 0594).

AAPSO has a special interest in the committee on Decolonization ( one of our former representatives Mrs Jane Woods was quite active in the committee), the Committee on Palestine and the Division on Palestinian rights. the different UN bodies in the field of Development. including the Centre on TNC. Following the meetings of the Coordinating Bureau of NAM is also of great importance to our organization. AAPSO is a member of the CONGO Board, as well. T111 new we do not have proper contacts with the NGLS and we quite rely on your assistance to straighten things out. We are not exactly happy with our relations with the NGO/DIESA unit of Panda Ayoub. All aspects of AAPSOls relations with the UN will emerge in the process of our cooperation. In fact we will rely to a great extend on your recommendations to improve our contacts with the UN. We will be very happy to have you as our representative in new Yerk. We had also the idea to have more Lhan one (2-3) representatives that could split the work among themselves. During the UNCED Prepcom 4 in NY. Panteley Spassov, AAPSO secretary. met the Pennanent representative of the PLO at the UN. Dr. Nasser Al Kidwa whom you possibly now. Dr. Nasser was willing to recommend an American citizen already active in the campaign for solidarity with the Palestinian people, to represent AAPSO at the UN on these issues . Till now he did not contact us. Could you meet him and discuss the issue? We think that such a division of work according to personal interests will be more acceptable as we are not in a position to provide stipend and we are covering only postage fax and etc. When we request you specifically to participate on behalf of AAPSO in some important conference we are in a position to provide 30 \$ per day. I am sure that your probable engagement with AAPSO will not detract you in any way from your WILPF work. May be a modus vivendi will evolve. when they will be complimentary to each other. The moment you agree to be our representative at the UN in New York we will make the necessary arrangements with the NGO/DIESA unit. ' Hoping to see you soon.  $\slash\,$  N
