See the conference schedule below. You can also refer to our paper previously sent to you, for the themes and content of our conference- Still you are free to raise your own points depending

on your perspectives and activities. You can make a longer written statement for distribution in the conference if you want to. (Note that you will.have more time to speak freely at the workshops to be held later in Tokyo, Hiroshima, and Nagasaki.) We will translate your speech draft into Japanese for distribution among the participants in the conference- Send your draft as early as possible to give us time for translation. (Help make our preparation work "peaceful. ") If you send the longer written statement early enough, we can translate it, too. (You can send your written statement only, and talk spontaneously at the conference, if you prefer.)
