ZIDS will host a UNESCO sponsored training seminar in Harare, Zimbabwe, from 20-24th February, to study ways and means of launching research programmes on the economic effects of South African policies of destabilization in the sub-region, the effects of state cohesion, the re-integration of returning mine workers, the effects of South African propaganda in the sub-region and in the presentation of the sub-region to the outside world, the impact of destabilization policies on education, science (including social sciences), communication and culture.

Particular attention will be paid to (a) the analysis of the phenomena; (b) ways of counteracting the destabilization policies of South Africa; (c) joint research and research priorities between institutions in the SADCC countries.
