To assist and advise existing groups of local blacksmiths scattered throughout the country on how to improve the quality of their work-manship and increase their production of agricultural hand tools.

To supervise the dissemination of modern hand tools through such schemes as hire purchase or subsidized prices to groups of rural blacksmiths.

To assist rural blacksmiths to improve the quantity of their products by introducing them to newer techniques of production.

To advise rural blacksmiths on how to increase their productivity while maintaining their use of hand tools and labor intensive technologies.

To improve and consolidate the existing supply lines of raw materials to rural blacksmiths; organizing regional collection points for metal scraps such as auto and truck leaf springs; organizing bulk purchases of metal blanks from Ubungo Farm Implements for shapping by blacksmiths etc.

To train a host national counterpart in skills to be used in providing correct extension advice to rural blacksmiths.

To collect the information as specified in the project document from each blacksmithing group.

Extensive experience in all types of blacksmithing operations, tools and processes. Particular emphasis is being placed on the production of simple agricultural tools (axes, hoes, adzes knives etc) in this project so direct experience with these lines of production would be highly desirable.

English, Swahili an asset

As a result of free importation of agricultural implements during the colonial period in Tanzania the position of the rural blacksmith who until that time produced all hand tools, became extremely tenuous. Faced with a superior product with which he could not compete, many of the blacksmiths gave up their profession or changed their line of production.

Today the Government of Tanzania is recognizing that those blacksmiths who remain active are potentially a great source of production for rural farm implements.

The aim of this project is to revitalize the rural blacksmithing groups in order to

- a) increase rural employment,
- b) develop skills in rural areas,
   c) increase the decentralization of the manufacture of agricultural tools,
- d) increase rural productivity.

The expert will work out of the Headquarters of SIDO in Dar-es-Salada and will advise the Government on correct extension to be given to rural blacksmiths to achieve the above objectives.
