RE: A note of concern from DIP about behaviour of Comrades

On many occasions, the above mentioned Department has been involved in what can be called "Camp Semi Administration" duties as most of the times the commander is not around for his because of his duties as the Co-ordinator. The problems that we handled range from theft, tribal conflicts, display of knives as the result of hatred that was mounting, day to day issues like food, general co-operation from the comrades and paying comrades their allowances if they are around. This resulted in comrades to have confidence in us and subsequently led to the comrades being closer to us as a result of the above mentioned reasons. This was mostly done for the sake of unity, co-operation and development of our army as we realised that nobody can or is interested in developing it from our Tanzanian comrades.

Because of the above-mentioned ~~666~~ reasons, the comrades tipped us of some other comrades (in the South African Extension Unit) who are in close contact with the Tanzanian comrades. There was nothing wrong of this except that there might be something sinister about their closeness. We took the matter as secretly as it was supposed to be, and investigated this comrades. As time went on we mounted raids in the bags and discovered materials. The materials ranged from Intelligence materials, some other warfare material, syringes and a whitish powder. This raised our concern and we made further investigations, from this nothing was discovered except that our comrades talk of depressions, loneliness and other reasons, hence they wanted to inject some drugs into their bodies as a move not to be loneliness and depressed. There were rumours that this comrades are in close contact with TPDF officers who are providing them with some of these things. We, in our investigations, we failed to confirm these allegations but the fact is the co-operation of the majority of comrades suspected to be in this game, deteriorated dramatically. There was nothing constructive they could talk about about the ANC (They are as reactionary as one could not believe).

Some of the comrades in this Education Centre, their whereabouts are not known except that they left to Dar Es Salaam. They never contacted any structure responsible before they leave. (e.g Cde Theo Nkosi).

After some time, we realised that there are comrades who are mobilising others on issues like allowances, that the ANC dumped them here in exile and is doing nothing as far as their welfare is concerned. They even went to the extent of saying that the ANC leadership in South Africa should come down and tell them why are they in Tanzania instead of India as they claim to have been promised before their departure in South Africa. Some of this issues affected greatly the morale of the comrades in the camp. We witnessed comrades chasing each other with knives and groupings along regional and tribal lines. Love and unity amongst our comrades vanished. It was out of little efforts that were done to reconcile the situation that at least at last comrades had a clear definition about each other. The JNCO's after finishing their training tried their level best to handle the situation and have proper control on the comrades at least the situation returned to normality a little.

The majority of the comrades in the Education Centre who their bags were searched without their knowledge ended up fighting each other about the material that was disappearing. They started to suspect each other and that is where we ended.

We are not sure what conclusion to take about this but we have a believe that either the comrades be called and explain about this materials or something be done to establish exactly what is happening about them.
