MEMBERS OF THE AFRICAN NATIONAL CONGRESS AT DAKAR MEETING -- 9-12 JULY, 1987

1. Kader ASMAL

Lecturer, specialising in international, human rights and labour law since 1963, Trinity College, Dublin. Born Stanger, Natal. BA (SA), LL.B., LL.M (LSE), MA (Dublin). Former Dean of Arts, TCD. Member, ANC Legal/Constitutional Dept. Founder member of British Anti-Apartheid Movement and founder and chairman of Irish AAM. Numerous articles on law on liberation and currently completing "Law on Liberation, International Law and Struggle against Apartheid." Nelson Mandela visiting professor, Rutgers University, 1987.

2. Selwyn GROSS, O.P.

Born Cape Town, left SA 1977. Member, UK regional religious committee of ANC. Rabbinical studies, 1967. Dominican since 1981, working at Blackfriars, Oxford. Studied English and comparative African government and law at UCT, and philosophy and theology, Oxford. Will be working on STL (licentiate in sacred theology, a Dominican research degree) thesis. Member, British anti-apartheid movement, member of AAM's national committee, 1985/6.

3. Z. Pallo JORDAN

Born OFS, grew up in Cape Town. Left South Africa 1962. Educated UCT, Britain and USA. Member of national exec. committee of ANC since July 1985. Member of NEC secretariat. Deputy director of information, responsible for research. Specialty: history.

4. Lindiwe MABUZA

Born Newcastle, Natal. Specialized in English literature at Stanford University, American studies at University of Minnesota. Taught comparative literature and comparative history, Ohio Univ. 1969-76. Fulltime ANC worker and ANC chief representative in Nordic countries since 1979. Also writes poetry.

5. Penuel M. MADUNA

Born Johannesburg. Studied law at Univ. of Zululand. B.Juris from Univ. of South Africa and LL.B. from the Univ. of Zimbabwe. Associates Johannesburg. Fulltime worker of ANC department of legal/constitutional affairs in Lusaka.

6. Bernard MAGUBANE

Professor. Born Umkhumbane, 1930. Educated at Natal University, BA, MA. UCLA: MA, Ph.D. Taught at University of Zambia 1967-70. Currently Professor of anthropology at Univ. of Connecticut, 1970. Interest -- urban anthropology, problem of race and class. Published extensively in journals and reviews. Forthcoming book: The Ties That Bind: Afro-Americans and Africa.

7. Mac MAHARAJ

Born in Newcastle, Natal. Member of national exec. committee since 1985. Served 12 years on Robben Island, 1964-76. Left SA 1977 and based in Lusaka since that time.



8. Manala MANZINI

Born, Johannesburg. Lived and studied in SA until 1976. Had to leave country as result of student uprisings of 1976, when a student at Univ. of Zululand. Member, national youth committee. and deputy head of ANC youth and student section.

9. Barbara MASEKELA

Grew up in Witbank and Alexandra township. Attended Inanda seminary, Natal. Went to university in USA; and Zambia. Taught literature at Rutgers University, New Jersey. Secretary for arts and culture, ANC, based in Lusaka.

10. Thabo MBEKI

Born in Transkei, 1942. Educated in SA and Britain. MA degree (economics) from Sussex Univ. Member, national exec. committee of ANC. ANC secretary for presidential affairs and director of information.

11. Francis MELI

Born in East London, left SA 1963 after short spell at Fort Hare Univ. Studied history in Leipzig (GDR) and obtained Ph.D. Editor, Sechaba. Member of national exec. committee of the ANC. Based in London

12. Aziz PAHAD

Born in Schweizer Reineke, Transvaal. BA (sociology), Wits Univ. MA (international relations), Sussex Univ. Banned, 1963. Member of national exec. committee of ANC. Fulltime functionary of ANC. Based in Britain.

13. Essop PAHAD

Born in Schweizer Reineke, Transvaal. Mother jailed three times. Served on executive comm, Tvl. Indian Youth Congress and Tvl. Indian Congress. Towards end of 1963, banned from all political activities and from pursuing postgraduate degree. BA, Wits Univ., 1963. D.Phil., Sussex Univ, 1972. Research worker, ANC.

14. Steve TSHWETE

Born in Springs, Transvaal. Grew up in Kingwilliamstown, E.Cape and worked in East London. Arrested there in 1963 and tried and sentenced to 15 years on Robben Island for ANC activities. Founder member, UDF and president of the Border region of the UDF until forced to leave the country in 1985.

15. Tony TREW

Born in Cape Town. Student at Stellenbosch, Wits., Oxford universities. BA, MA, B.Phil. Lecturer in philosophy and political theory, Univ. of East Anglia. Previously researching current developments in SA at present. 1964-5: in jail in Pretoria as political prisoner.

16. Harold WOLPE

Born in Johannesburg. BA (social studies), Ll.B., Wits. university. Lawyer handling mainly political cases, 1954-63. Detained 1960 under state of emergency; again in 1963. Escaped from prison to Britain. Presently teaching sociology at Essex university. ANC Education council and research.
