## 1. DISCUSSIONS WITH NATIONAL PARTY

The meeting was informed of a PAC claim to the killing of a policeman and that we agreed to meet PAC on this.

### **APC**

Date: The date was set for 29 November and an alternate date is 9 December

Venue: Fanie v.d. Merwe and Maduna/Morobe to find appropriate venue.

Composition: The NP is opposed to TIC and NIC participation as extensions of the ANC. They agreed to TBVC states as participators. We are to consult on government's participation and they will do so on COSATU participation.

Convenor: We opposed the chief justice to be the convenor. We proposed that two religious leaders (Heyns and Mogoba) should join him. They accepted this but they will consult first.

Preparatory Committee: We agreed to have ANC, IFP, DP, NP, Gazankulu and Kangwane in this body. The CP will be invited by us. They opposed the SACP's participation. If we include the SACP then the LP and NPP should also be included. The matter was left for the principals to consider.

The first meeting will take place on the 15 November with two reps from each party. Next meeting planned for 12 November at 5:30 p.m. in Johannesburg.

Cde Zola (ANC) and Francois Venter (NP) will draft statement for APC.

The question of consultations and briefings of Bantustan leaders, chiefs, and other organisations was raised and debated, but the meeting failed to resolve the matter as many suggestions were put forward with no conclusion reached.

## 2. PARAGRAPH 3

There was a report-back on a meeting between Cde President and De Klerk on Paragraph 3. The issues raised were left to the liaison committee to resolve.

Point 2 and 3 on the agenda were not dealt with because of time.
