KING SOBHUZA II DIES AT EMBO

HIS Majesty, King Sobhuza II, Ngwenyama of Swaziland, is dead.

He was 83 and the longest reigning monarch in the world.

The official announcement of his death was made by the Prime Minister, Prince Mabandla, and the Governor of Lobamba Royal Residence, Mr. Vusumuzi Bhembe, at a press conference last night.

The statement said:

"I have it in command from Her Royal Majesty the Queen Mother, of the Kingdom of Swaziland, to announce with deep regret and profound sorrow the passing away of our beloved sovereign, His Majesty King Sobhuza the Second, which occurred at Embo State House on Saturday the 21st of August, 1982.

"In accordance with Swazi law and custom, Her Majesty the Queen Mother has now assumed all the powers and responsibilities as of the Head of State of the Kingdom of Swaziland.

"The nation will be notified of the arrangements in due course."

Mr. Bhembe has asked all chiefs and Emabutfo in the country to assemble in the Lobamba Royal Kraal today.

The announcement of the King's death followed a day of intense activity at Lobamba, including a meeting of the Cabinet and of representatives of the Royal Family.

**PUBLIC STATEMENT ON THE PASSING AWAY OF HIS

MABANDLA**

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

I have it in command from Her Royal Majesty the Queen Mother of the Kingdom of Swaziland to announce with deep regret and profound sorrow the passing away of our beloved sovereign, His Majesty King Sobhuza the Second which occurred at Embo State House on Saturday the 21st of August, 1982.

2. In accordance with Swazi Law and Custom, Her Majesty the Queen Mother has now assumed all the powers and responsibilities as of the Head of State of the Kingdom of Swaziland.

3. The nation will be notified of other arrangements in due course.

The official announcement.

throughout the day from all parts of the Kingdom.

Earlier, the first unofficial reports of the King's death began circulating after it was announced that all sports fixtures had been cancelled in the Kingdom.

But senior officials refused to confirm the news until an official statement had been made.

King Sobhuza II only last month celebrated his 83rd birthday at a colourful ceremony in Mbabane.

On Friday, at Lozitha, he presided over what was to be his

last official engagement when he received reports from the envoys who had travelled all over Africa to put Swaziland's stand on the land incorporation deal to African leaders.

His death comes less than a year after his glittering Diamond Jubilee celebrations, to mark his 60th year on the throne.

They were attended by dignitaries from all over the world, including Britain's Princess Margaret.

His Majesty was born on July 22, 1899, to King Bhunu and Lomawa. He was named Nkhotfofjeni and from his grandmother, Labotsibeni, received the name Mona.

He had three brothers and three sisters. When the Royal Council met to choose a new king, following the death of King Bhunu in the same year, they sent Bhunu's only sister to the Queen Regent, Labotsibeni for her opinion. She chose Nkhotfofjeni and added: "That is why I fetched Lomawa from her people."

While still a young King, threatening news was circulating by a local burgher that a son of Mbilini was on his way to kill Sobhuza.

The burgher, known then as Disi, handed firearms to the young King's guards so that they could kill Mbilini's son. This proved to be a hoax. There were other similar unfounded stories.

King Sobhuza II, on reaching the age of 21, was officially installed as Ngwenyama of Swaziland by his grandmother, Labotsibeni. This was in 1921.

One of the first problems he had to face, and one that would constantly recur, was the question concerning the land partitions.

As this matter had been decided by the British government, the Swazi nation agreed that the King should take up the matter with London.

In 1920, the Swazi nation signed a petition to the British High Commissioner, Prince Arthur, in which they asked for the repeal of certain proclamations, the control of Swazi na-

tional funds and the restoration of Sobhuza's authority as king of his country.

The High Commissioner refused to consider the issue in the petition and also objected politely to the use by the Swazis of the style "King of Swaziland" when referring to Sobhuza II.

He advised them to continue using the term "Paramount Chief."

A delegation, led by King Sobhuza II, started a lawsuit and petitioned the Special Court of Swaziland on the "Unallotted Lands Concession," which had originally been granted by King Mbandzeni to John Thorburn and Frank Watkins for 50 years, at an annual rental of E50.

This was granted during the Mbandzeni's illness. His secretary and adviser, Allister Miller, had taken control of the lands and was evicting the Swazis from it. In spite of numerous documents the Swazis produced to prove that Britain had no legal right to partition Swaziland, the case was dismissed. Further appeals were also dismissed.

Swaziland helped Britain during the two World Wars with both financial and manpower assistance to remind Britain of the promises she had made to King Mbandzeni, regardless of the bitter experiences they had suffered under their protector.

The Swazi forces were given heroes' welcome on their return, for having fought very bravely and enthusiastically.

In March 1947, a year after the return of the Swazi forces, the Swazi nation welcomed King George VI, the Queen and their two daughters at Goedegun (now Nhlanguano). King George thanked the Swazi people for their contribution to the war.

The first parliament was opened in 1967 at the High Court in Mbabane.

After lengthy talks Swaziland was granted her independence in 1968.

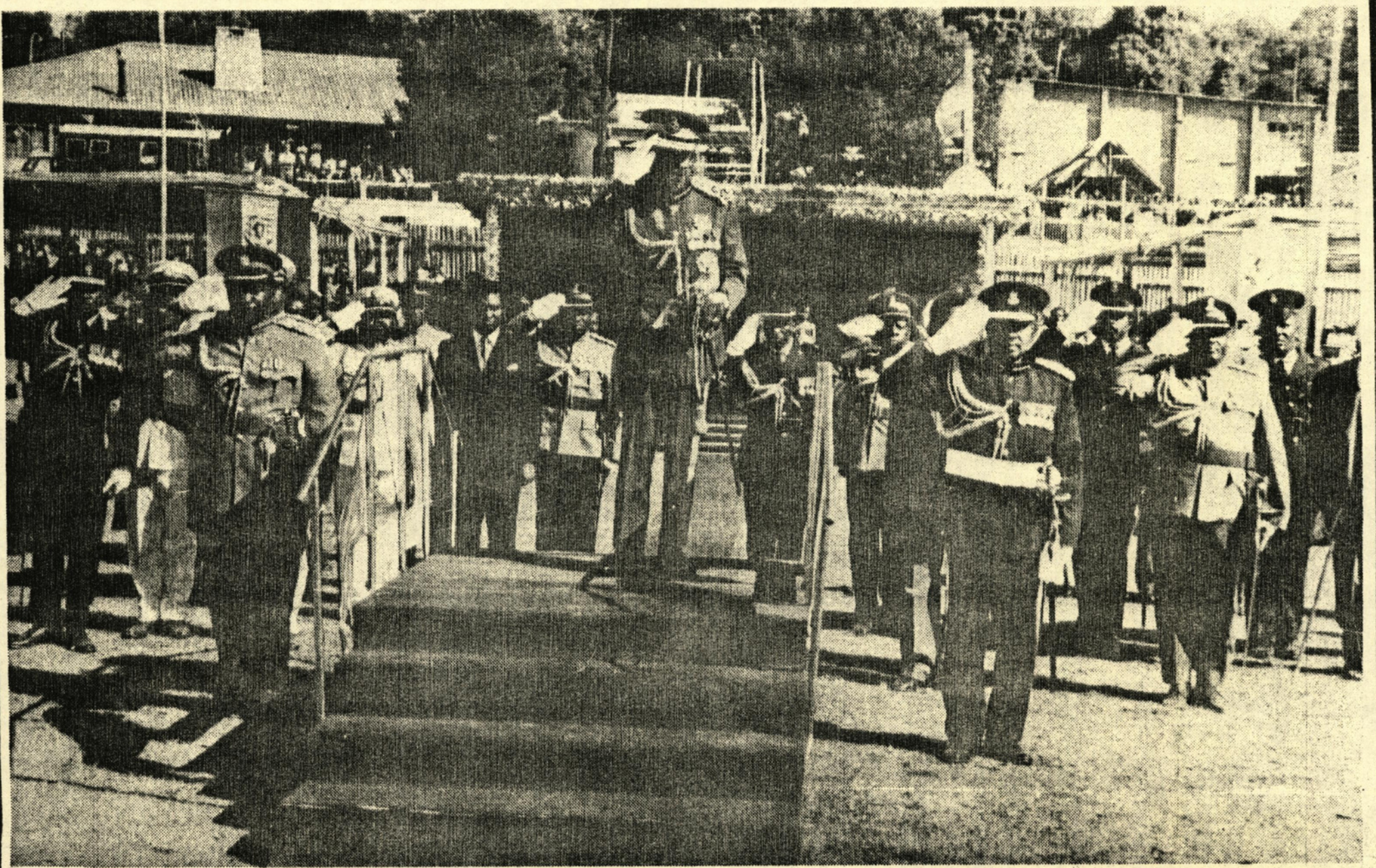
His Majesty later abolished political parties in a national meeting in 1973.



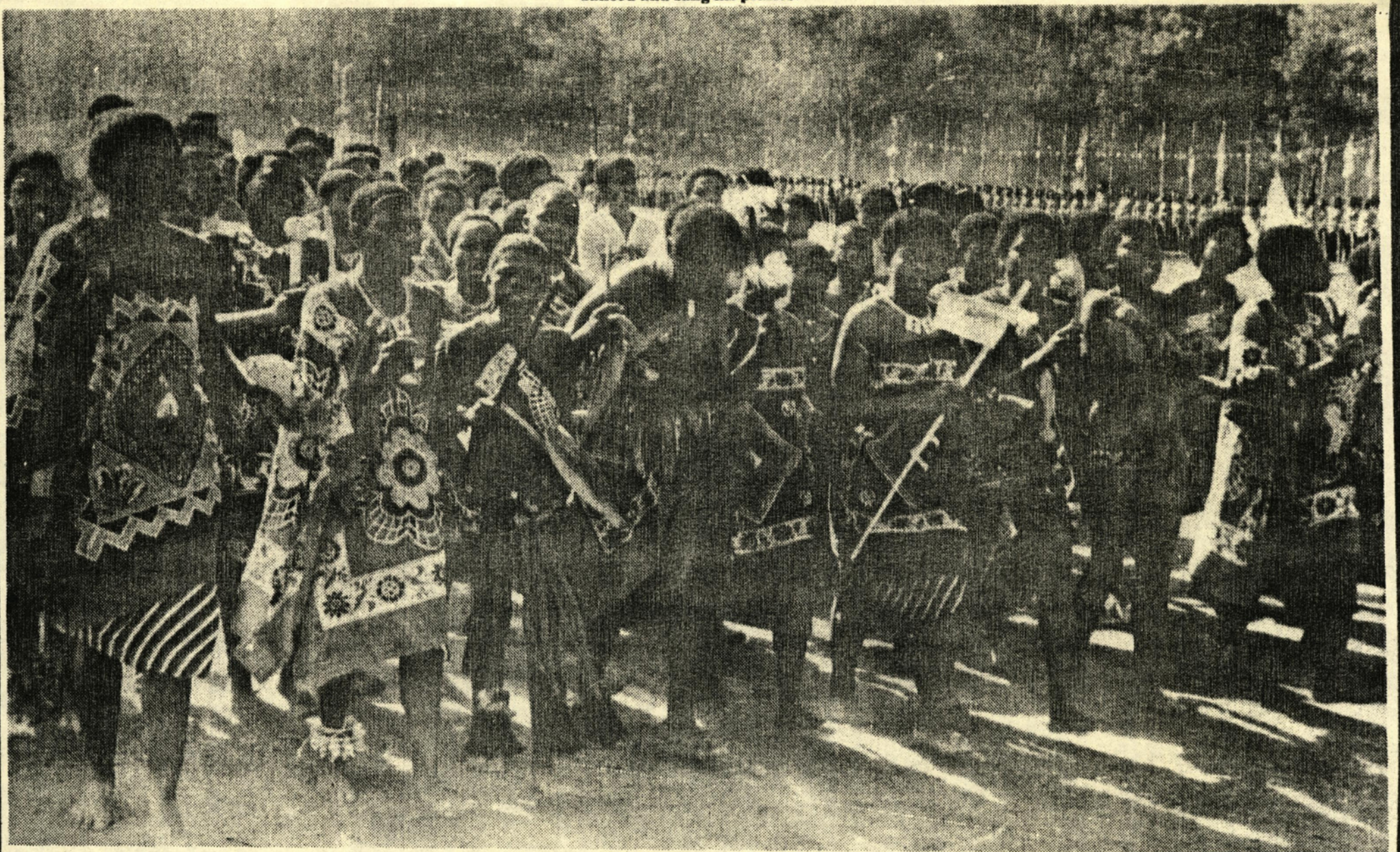

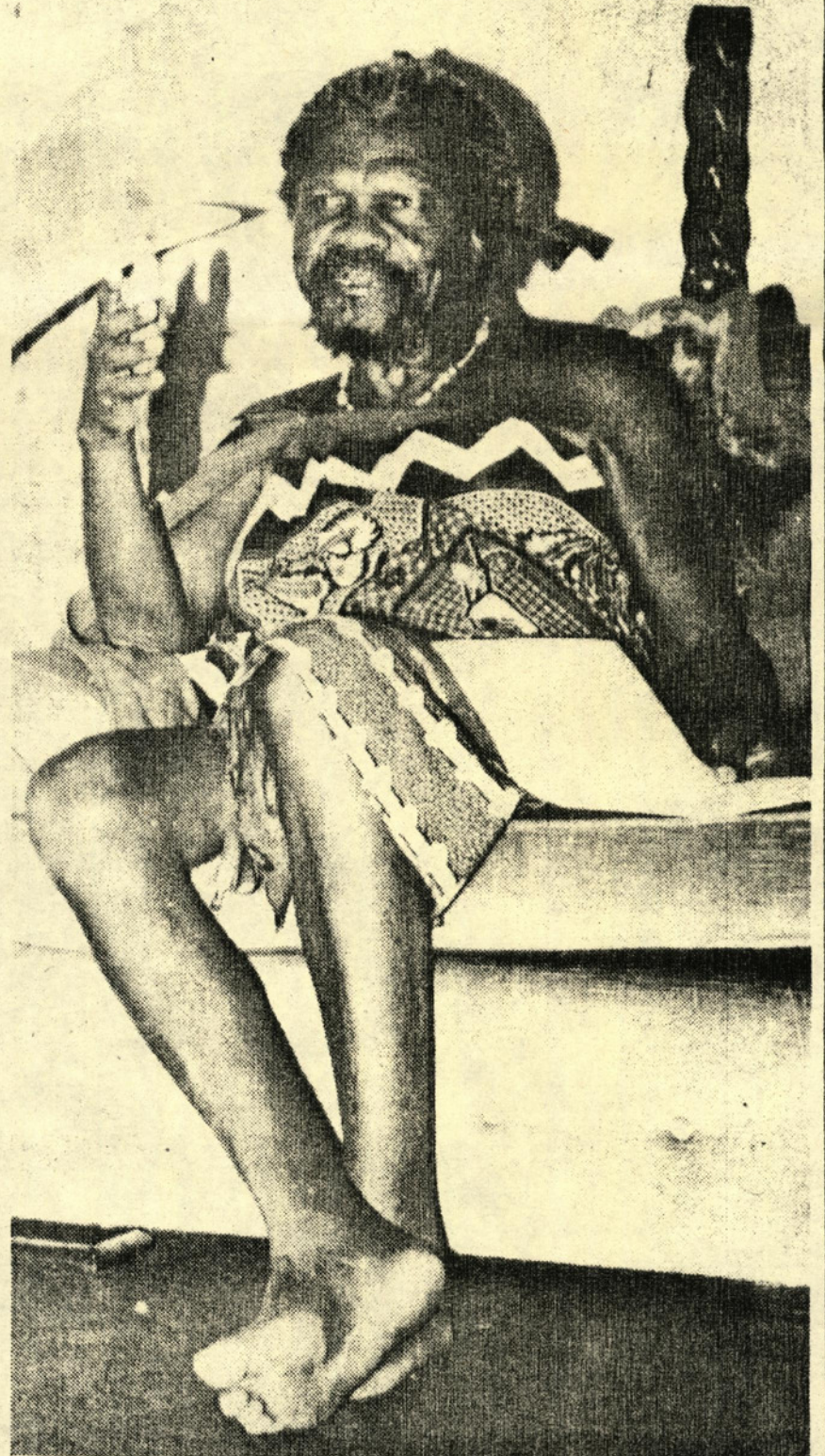

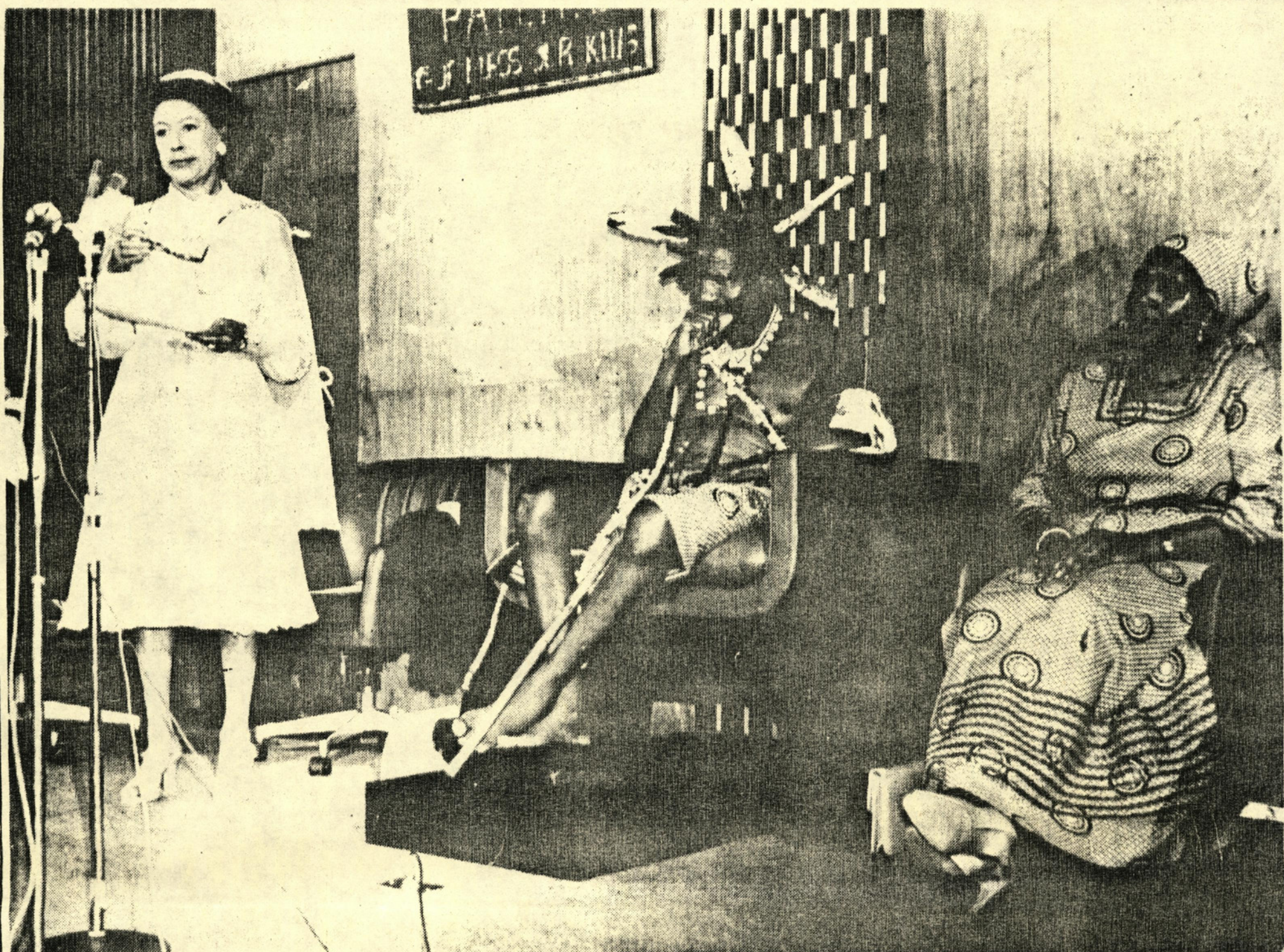

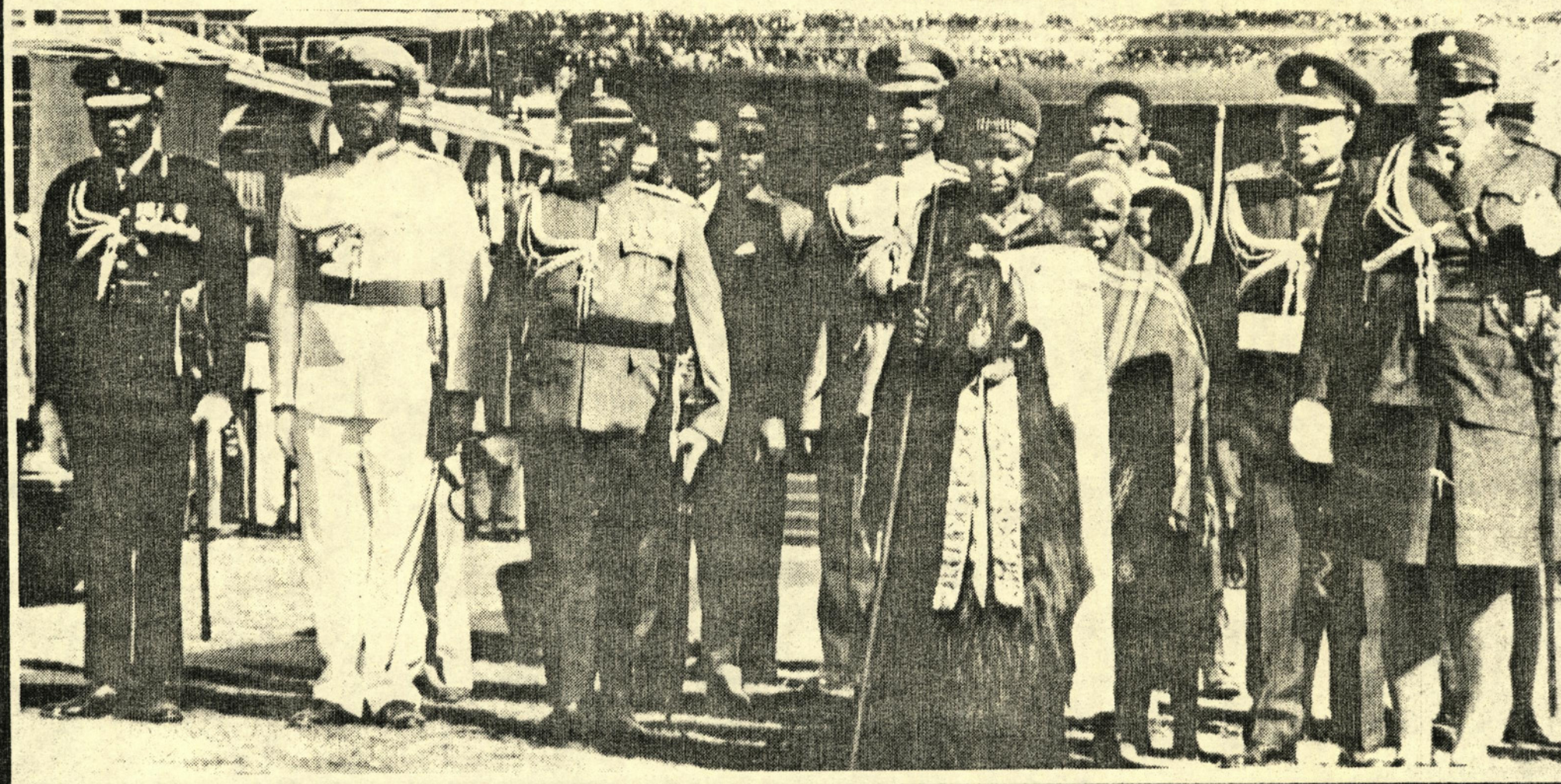

LET'S PUT SOME THOUGHT INTO IT!

By SAM LUKHELE

THE realisation is slowly dawning on some of the notables in local soccer that the game here needs a massive, continuous coaching programme if it is to grow and flourish at all levels.

The stimulation provided by professional soccer is simply not enough to raise our standards and the problem is more acute in the light of less participating in international scene.

There is an incredible amount of natural talent that is crying out for guidance and a lot of gifted

ball players are becoming stale through lack of proper coaching.

If evidence was needed the benefits of intensive coaching were no more strikingly illustrated than in the World Cup by Kuwait, a country hitherto more famous for its fondness for lavish living than its football prowess.

There is, of course, a scheme in operation, but it has barely scratched the surface.

It is limited in scope, suffering as it does from the limitations imposed by a lack of finance.

"Out coaching programme is beginning to get off the ground very nicely," says Mr Theo Dumitru, the national coach. "But the ideal of course is to have a full-time coaching staff."

We need to become more coaching-conscious and sponsors should be made to realise just how good an investment coaching is.

This country has arguably some of the more naturally skillful players in the world, but tactically we are way behind and haven't got the discipline to play to the systems used worldwide.

More and more senior and former players are becoming involved in coaching, but they need the opportunity and financial incentive to become professionals.

There is a strong body of opinion that believes we should recruit overseas coaches urgently to expose local players and coaches to the latest trends.

Provided we get the right people, there is no need to fear that the skill and flair of our players will be stifled.

There is a tremendous amount of ground to cover and the sooner we get started on expanding and improving the present programme the better.

It is a huge undertaking that requires a lot of planning by the football authorities and established

coaches but the biggest problem is, as always money.

Football has attracted a lot of sponsorship and it would be interesting to see what response it would get if it made a plea for substantial assistance for coaching.

And it should start thinking of putting some of its own money into the scheme.

Man cleared of court assault

A MBABANE magistrate has acquitted a man who was accused of attacking another person and his lawyer in court.

Enock Dlamini had been charged with punching Phillemon Ngwenya on the back of the neck.

Giving evidence Ngwenya told Magistrate Lawrence Thwala that he had just been acquitted by the magistrate when suddenly seven men grabbed some exhibits in court and charged at him with his defence lawyer Mr David Matse.

Ngwenya had been charged with malicious

damage to property by killing 10 herd of cattle belonging to Dlamini and his six brothers.

"When the case came to an end, I was found not guilty and the seven men immediately charged towards me," explained Ngwenya.

Ngwenya said the men were insulting him together with his lawyer and they also threatened to kill both of them.

Ngwenya and Matse then slipped out of the court

through the magistrate's

door and as they escaped Dlamini struck Ngwenya with his fist on the neck, Mr Thwala was told.

Noise

Mr Matse told the court that there was a lot of noise inside the court and that he saw Dlamini strike Ngwenya next to the ear with his fist.

He said the court orderly, Constable Matsenjwa intervened and he escorted Ngwenya and himself into the clerk's office.

After Constable Matsenjwa had locked them inside the office, some members of the violent crowd peeped through the window and threatened Ngwenya with violence.

Giving evidence Constable Matsenjwa said he did not see Dlamini assaulting Ngwenya but only heard a woman shouting inside the court where he found there was a squabble between the men and Ngwenya together with Matse.

The magistrate said the police officer was the person who could have seen everything happening in court as he was at the back.

He also mentioned that Ngwenya says Dlamini fisted him behind his neck and Matse says Ngwenya was assaulted next to the ear.

He said therefore there was no evidence whether Ngwenya was assaulted or not.

WATER CRISIS LOOMS

Mr Muir who is also manager of the Swaziland Youth Soccer Squad is going to Atlanta University where he will pursue to degree course in Educational Administration.

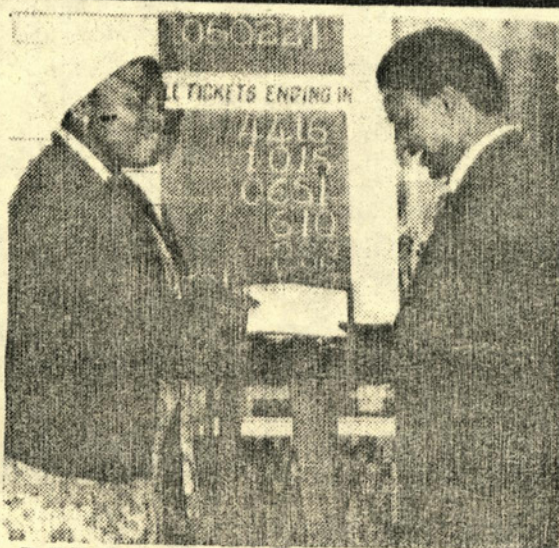
The course is sponsored by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID).

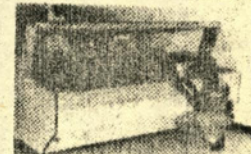

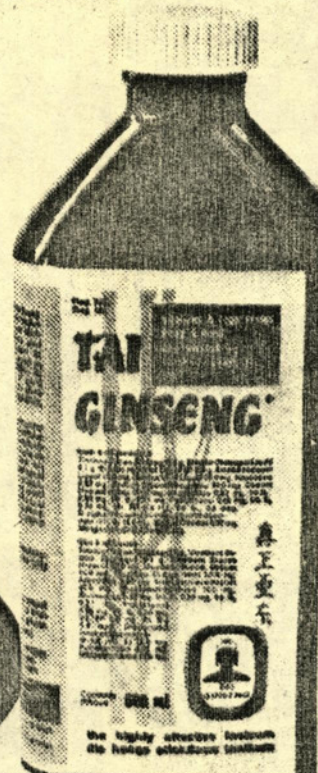

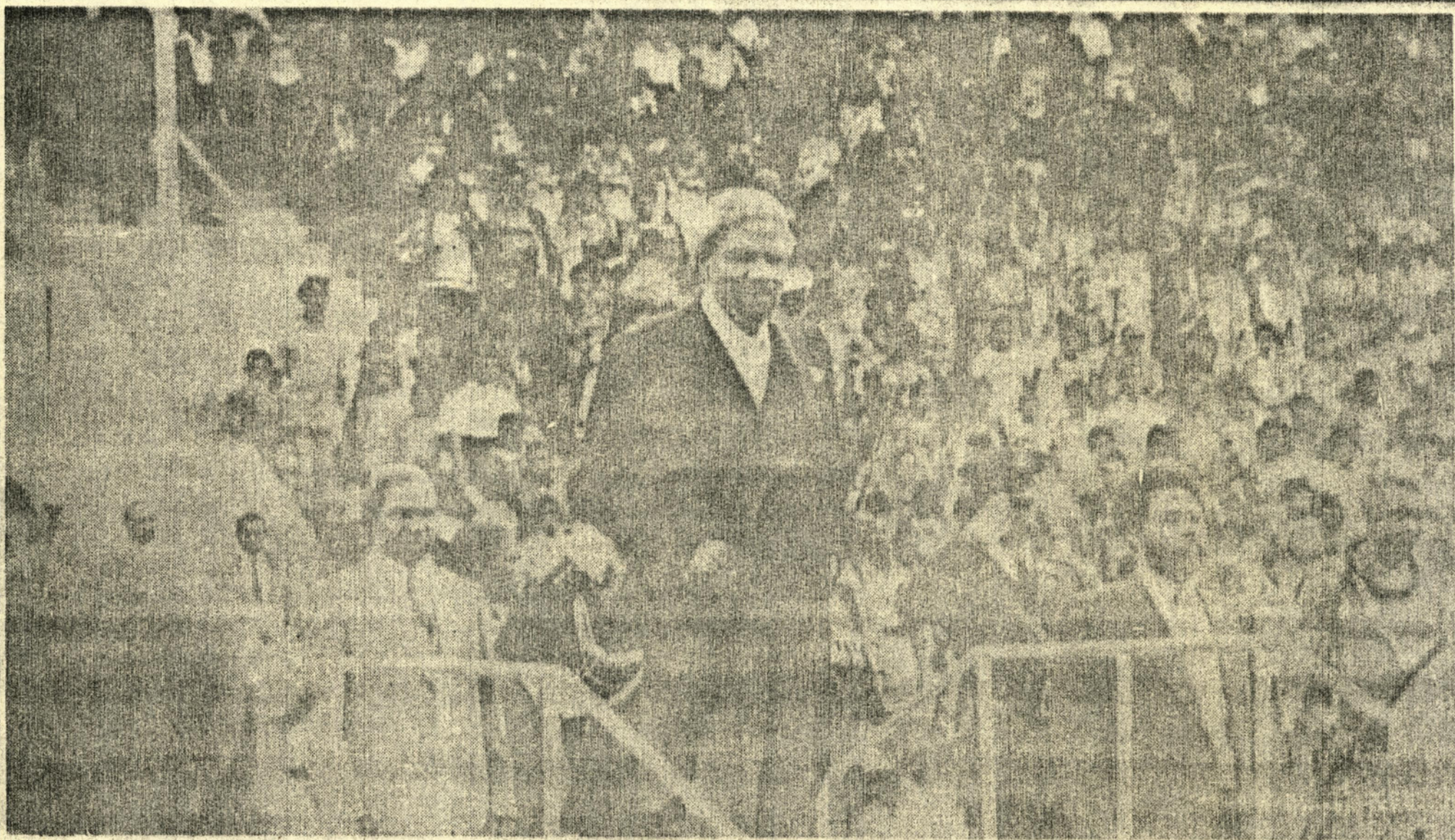

The Mozambique Ambassador, Mr. Daniel Magaia, said: "I feel a very great sadness. Really I feel like I have lost a father. I was informed by the Ministry for Foreign Affairs and I just did not know what to say.

"I feel I am weeping together with the entire Swazi nation. His death is not just a loss to the Swazis, but to this part of Africa, the whole continent and the entire world.

"His Majesty was a great leader and statesman and I think not only the Swazis but humanity as a whole has lost a wise and great King.

"I am sorry, that is all I can say at the moment because I really feel upset."
