Dear Mr. Tambo, Your fax, dated 24th. December 1990, to the Chancellorship (which was forwarded to me in Cape Town on 18th. January after the University re-opened) was received with great joy by the Executive Committee of Council meeting at Fort Hare on Friday 8th. February, which was the actual 75th. birthday of the University. I have not replied sooner as we have been waiting for a suitable moment to release this news publicly. We feel that moment has now arrived thus I am writing to you to confirm that we are ready to make the announcement. We thought that the best way of doing this would be to issue a simple press release from Fort Hare but we wondered whether wish to make any statement to accompany our release or whether you would prefer to wait for the press to approach you after the news is made public. Also could you possibly advise us where we might obtain a good photograph of yourself (unless you think it adequate for us to rely on existing newspaper files). We should like to move as quickly as possible but without rushing. Perhaps it would be best if we time the news for Wednesday or Thursday next week (13th or 14th March) so that we may have a few days in which to prepare the release in full consultation with yourself, Speaking personally, I think it would be a good idea if there was some reference in the University's press statement to your early work as a teacher of Maths and Physics. You may recollect that Mrs Tambo sent me a brief biographical outline of yourself on the 4th. December. a fuller biographical note is now available that would be very helpful but it is not essential although we should like to have a list of the honours and awards (including any honorary degrees) that you have received.
