To sum up, the officials we met were supportive but all claimed that any decisions were o ut of

their hands. i felt they were just going through the motions, being polite. It makes me w onder

WHO are the groups determining what happens in Hong Kong. But we got good publicity, which

increases peoples awareness and the powers that be know we are around to comment on polic ies.

It gave our members a focus and helps to renew enthusiasmAny visits of this kind are very valu-

able.

We are having our AGM at the end of the month. lwill be giving a report and I intend to g ive our

members a run-down and definition in detail on. what the principle pillars of apartheid a re, what

they actually mean, which have been abolished, which remain. I want to make a simple table for

quick reference and then give a statement of What has happened in the last year in SA and how

much remains to be done and arm them with some facts for their reference. If you have any thing

that sets these facts out clearly and up-to date it would be an enormous help.

Ntombi talked about a project in the Eastern Transvaal where the local chief has given them a plot

of land. We are considering raising funds to be donated for specific items -fencing, seed s, farm

implements, a tractor. This would be something people could identify with Jocal school children

here could get involved, perhaps writing letters to counterparts in SA, helping with fund -raising

projects. We could be sent photographs to keep us in touch with developments. What are yo ur

comments?

We enjoyed having Ntomhi staying with us and she and Gerry had long discussions at breakf ast

and we all sat and talked before we went to bed. Gerry and I felt thoroughly "politicised " by the

end. I hope she wasnit too exhausted with me dragging her all over the place.

I have just spoken to Richard Vines on the phone and he says to thank you for your help. It

appears though that he had a hard time getting the interview.

You must have had a very busy time over the last few months.
