Dear Comrades

Many of you who are contemplating returning to South Africa may be anxious to secure employment and therefore security of income before you actually depart. Given that our Movement is under extreme pressure of work and that we are having to deal with very real serious problems at home in our attempts to attain a goal of democracy and freedom, our offices at home are not teadysto assist you in any real sense with the practical side of obtaining employment. It would, therefore, be up to you individually to do so.

As this task is made extremely difficult from such a distance, we have obtained certain information which will be of assistance to those of you wishing to follow this path. = For this purpose, I enclose herewith the following:
