Mr President,

The Swedish Alliance Mission'erouth (SAU) is a Christian organization with a membership of approximately 14 000 young people. We confess Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour. In accordance with the teachings of the Bible, we believe in the equal and inviolable worth of all human beings. It is from this point of vantage that we want to work for peace and reconciliation.

Due to the fact that you, the South African Government, have the samt confession as we have, it is with extreme apprehension and sorrow that we have witnessed the recent intensified and indiscriminate exercise of violence in South Africa.

We strongly protest and condemn the use of weapon and torture by the police and the military forces against the civilians and dissident individuals.

At the same time as we write this letter to you, mr President, we_are writing a similar letter to the ANC in which we appeal to them to find a peaceful solution. It is, however, our Opinion that the South African Government, by its apartheidâ\200\224policy, bears the whole responsibility for the prevailing conflict-filled situation. It is our solid conviction that there will be no solution to the South African problem untill all the racial groups enjoy some influence in the whole of South Africa and that all the political parties participate in the decision-making-process concerning the future of the country.

We therefore appeal to you, mr President:

- to introduce, without any further delay whatsoever, negotiations with all the political parties and groups including the ANC, the UDF etc., regarding the future of the country,

- to work for the total dismantling of the abominable apartheid-policy, in such a way that all the citizens obtain full rights in their ONLY homeland, South Africa.

We believe that the true Church of Christ has an important role to play in the struggle towards reconciliation and peace. We therefore appeal to you, mr President, to listen to its representatives and let them be involved in the necessary redressing process.

We hope that our appeal to you, mr President, will meet your favourable consideration and we assure you that we wish South Africa all the best.
