REPORT ON ANC STUDENTS : SIDA AND NPA

1. NPA has received copy of a fax from ANC informing them of the impending closure of (u

the Education office in Zimbabwe. This to be done with immediate effect as the education function of the officer Peter Kane is nullified. The fax goes on to say the '1'mst will g et in

touch with us regarding the future co-operation and further instructions. A meeting was arranged in which this new situation was discussed between Peter and NPA and again later between Sipho and NPA. .

The two meetings noted that the welfare of the remaining students had to be taken care of including also the problem of accommodation. There was need to create a focal point whereby the students under the programme could relate to regarding their problems and needs. Both parties expressed the wish that the students must continue to be supported to help them. Thus measures have to be adopted to safeguard the smooth running of the programmes until the end of the year when they sit their final examinations.

A. NPA will as to now directly pay the stipends and fees to the students. This means the students have to come on a monthly basis to collect. their cheques and sign the appropriate documents for our accounting purposes. This is only for the students stationed in Harare.

B. The Financial Controller will visit Bulawayo once a month in parry nut tho. same man vino as almv tu tho studsits attending school in the South.

C. NPA will assist the students in getting their Students permits as and when the existing ones expire. This is no problem for NPA as it has done it before with the Namibian students.

D. That the South African authorities (ANC) needs w :mlvu tin; p; ublom Of immismtkm and almighty, theii ietum upon eumplutuu uf theii studies. This problem of providing transport for returning students needs urgent attention. Other problems that have to be solved pen lain w the medical aid as the ANC doctor who used to attend to them has also left the Country. 11' need be them should be some adjustments to the budgets to also include medical cover.

Ii. A meeting with the South African students is to be convened in the following week in which they are informed of the new situation to avoid any confusion in the future.

F . Contacts with the schools and colleges is to be made to also inform them where they send the statements of accounts. This will be a joint effort by both Peter (before he leaves the country) and the NPA.
