In 1982, the Washington-based Inter-  
national Center for Development Policy

created the Commission on United  
States-Central American Relations  
out of a deep concern over the tendency  
of American policymakers to view the  
countries of the Caribbean region solely  
in terms of East versus West. We joined  
together in a nonpartisan citizensâ\200\231  
commission to review systematically  
events and current policies in that  
region, and to propose alternatives  
that can be debated and adopted  
by public officials.

Out of like concern for the sanctity of

human life and human rights, the Center  
soon established similar commissions  
on US. relations with Asia and with  
Africa.

haired by the former Ambassador  
to El Salvador, Robert E. White,

the Commissions have enlisted over  
500 able and influential members and  
some 10,000 supporters throughout the  
United States. Commissioners include  
former Ambassadors, Congressmen and  
former Senators, former officials from  
the Departments of State and Treasury  
and the National Security Council,  
along with businesspeople, church  
and labor leaders, top scholars and  
specialists in Third World area studies.

n 1986, the International Center is  
launching its most ambitious effort

confrontation in regional conflicts in  
Central America, Asia and Africa.

twenty-five times before Congressional committees, appeared dozens of times on major network news and talk shows and published findings and recommendations in hundreds of magazines and newspapers. Commission findings have been viewed and read by millions of Americans and by millions more overseas.
