We would like to have Winnie Mandela as a major speaker at this event. Her appearance at our meeting would have enormous impact on the American people and would do much to shape public opinion.


We are prepared to pay for all the expenses of the trip, including the expenses of the person who will accompany her.

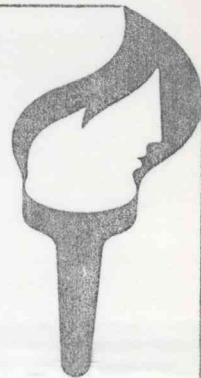
