Born: 1923, Nkanyani, northern Transvaal.

Hlungwane worked for some time for a tea and coffee merchant and later for a mattress manufacturer. Having lost a finger in an industrial accident, Hlungwane was retrenched, and returned to Gazankulu. His home is at Mbokoto, a village near Elim in north western Gazankulu. Here, at the site of his 'New Jerusalem', a Karmi structure at which he has laboured for thirty years, Hlungwane carves and administers to the members of his selfformed church 'Yesu Galeliya One Apostol in Sayoni Alt and Omega.'


