## MEDICAL PERSONNEL AT MAZIMBU

The RPC would like to draw your attention to the fact that there are no fulltime trained medical personnel attending to the health problems of the very large population at Mazimbu.

The consequent inadequate medical care given our people at Mazimbu is resulting in a situation where students are constantly being brought back and forth to Dar es Salaam for treatment at great expense, and the disruption of their activities at mazimbu.

The RPC discussed this issue at great length and we came up with the following conclusions/suggestions which we have referred to the local Medical Committee:

- 1. There is a dire need for a full-time, trained medical attendant to be resident at Mazimbu. In this matter we appeal for your assistance in co-ordination with the ANC Medical Committee. Presumably medical staff are being sought to run the planned clinic at Mazimbu. We would like to stress that the need for medical personnel is immediate and urgent and request that someone be sent as soon as possible. We are in the meantime trying to enlist the assistance of Comrade Poppy Opiote, a trained nurse, to help out temporarily at Mazimbu.
- 2. More use should be made of the medical services of the embassies of freendly countries. Apparently offers of assistance have been made to the office (e.g. by the Cuban Embassy) but have not been taken up. The RPC has suggested to the local Medical Committee that a meeting of all doctors from friendly embassies be convened, at which our medical problems are discussed and ways planned of utilising the assistance of our friends in resolving them.
- All students who arrive in East Africa should undergo a thorough medical examination, and if necessary, treatment, before being sent on to Mazimbu. This will minimise the 'medical traffic' between Dar and Morogoro. It was thought that doctors from fraternal embassies could usefully assist in giving medica l examinations.

We shall keep you informed of any developments towards the resolution of this problem.
