On Department of Political Education

Main tasks of the Department, main content and direction of training programme.

Conference directed the NEC to set up the Department of Political Education. Its main functions are:

- (a) the preparation of materials as may be useful for conducting political lessons;
- (b) the drafting and implementation of a syllabus with reading lists. Particular attention to be given to materials coming from inside the country;
- (c) the appointment and monitoring of political instructors in every region.

The main content of the envisaged syllabus as decided by Conference should cover the following:

- (1) History of our country with focus on the wars of resistance against the colonisers;
- (2) History of our liberation struggle and the development of our policy programme, the Freedom Charter, seizure of political and economic power, armed struggle, the role of the working class;
- (3) The resistance movement today, embracing workers, women, youth and students:
- (4) The history and role of trade union movement;
- (5) Theory of revolution;
- (6) National liberation and class struggle;
- (7) The emancipation of women;
- (8) Political economy of South Africa;
- (9) The liberation alliance ANC, SACP, SACTU.
- Additionally the Conference report recommends that 'mobile' libraries be organised with literature relevant to our political training. Further it stresses that our cadres should also be exposed to progressive literature and experiences of revolutionary movements in other parts of the world. In order to give variety to the political training and make the course more attractive, it is also recommended that we should diversify our teaching methods by such means as documentary films, videos and tape recordings.



CIRCULAR - ON THE TRAINING OF POLITICAL CADRES TO: DEPARTMENTS AND SECTIONS OF THE MOVEMENT FROM: DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL EDUCATION 1. There is an urgent need to train cadres in political science and related subjects for service at home, now and after the transition to people's power in a liberated and democratic South Africa. A revolution involves more than a seizure of power. The most difficult revolutionary aim is the transformation of society. In our case, this is a hard and protracted process requiring the mobilisation of all institutions that shape the thinking and conduct of people of the different national and social groups. 11. The oppressed black sections of our population including the white community must learn to discard habits and attitudes derived from the pre-

- II. The oppressed black sections of our population including the white community must learn to discard habits and attitudes derived from the prevailing system of apartheid colonialism. It is a pernicious institution that sinks its roots deep into our minds and patterns of behaviour. To eradicate this legacy, an intensive process of re-education is necessary.
- III. We must prepare ourselves for this process now. We need cadres with a high level of training in political and other social sciences, who will be able to take our message to the people as educators, propagandists and agitators. They will be deployed as and when their training is completed. The DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL EDUCATION will consider applications from suitably qualified cadres for training overseas.
 - IV. In the interest of efficiency, arrangements for political studies abroad will be centralised with the DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL EDUCATION. The main role to be fulfilled by the various Departments and Sections of the Movement is to identify potential candidates in their own ranks in good time. Preferably these should be comrades who are permanently deployed in the Departments/Sections who are not therefore "in transit". In other words, they should be comrades that do not have any other secret plans either than the given assignments. They should be committed members of our Movement, who want to serve our revolution.

It has been brought to our notice that some of the comrades sent abroad are poorly prepared for the courses in which they enrol. We think it will be useful if cadres going on such studies are put through a course of basic political training including history of our struggle by our Department.


