Dear Comrade Mangezi

Re : The case of Victoria and Tony Ditshebe

In honour of an instruction from the Chief Representative office through your office, that the subject be handled by our zonal structures, our office wishes to submit facts consisting a progress report at this juncture;

1. The main complement, Victoria Ditshebe, had expressed in certain terms that she would like to go back to Luanda as soon as it is possible for us to arrange for her - this reason on her part is fuelled by the foresight that very soon the A. N. C. would be going home and she would not have a security against her husband both here and at home.
2. She agreed to the idea of getting a separate house on conditions that meanwhile preparations are being done.
3. She is not prepared to leave her children behind and therefore foresee that the husband is likely to blackmail her with that to remain. In this regard she requested that the issue be left with her to negotiate with her husband.
4. Of-late, she does go and meet her children in V-4 outside her house, and her observation is that the husband is somehow lenient in attitude.
5. Cde Tony is alleging that his wife is involved with unmarried people.
6. He also claims to have discovered that she sleeps at Cde. Tosh's place ( a boy-friend according to him ) where some of her clothes are kept.




7. Cde. Tony is apparently about to depart for school and the wife agreed to remain with children.
8. He, cde. Tony alleges that Z. P. C. mishandled the case behind Co-ordinator because Tosh, Construction Treasurer has been bribing them.
9. He also claims that he discovered that his wife used to lie when saying she is consulting the Angolans in D-SM. whilst going out with a boy-friend.
10. From time to time the wife threatens to appeal to her ambassador to assist her going home.

Our observation is that there is still a room to reconcile the two, in the light of their mutual conservations. Our office will invite the two, together with Z. P. C. to try and finalise the issue at hand this week.

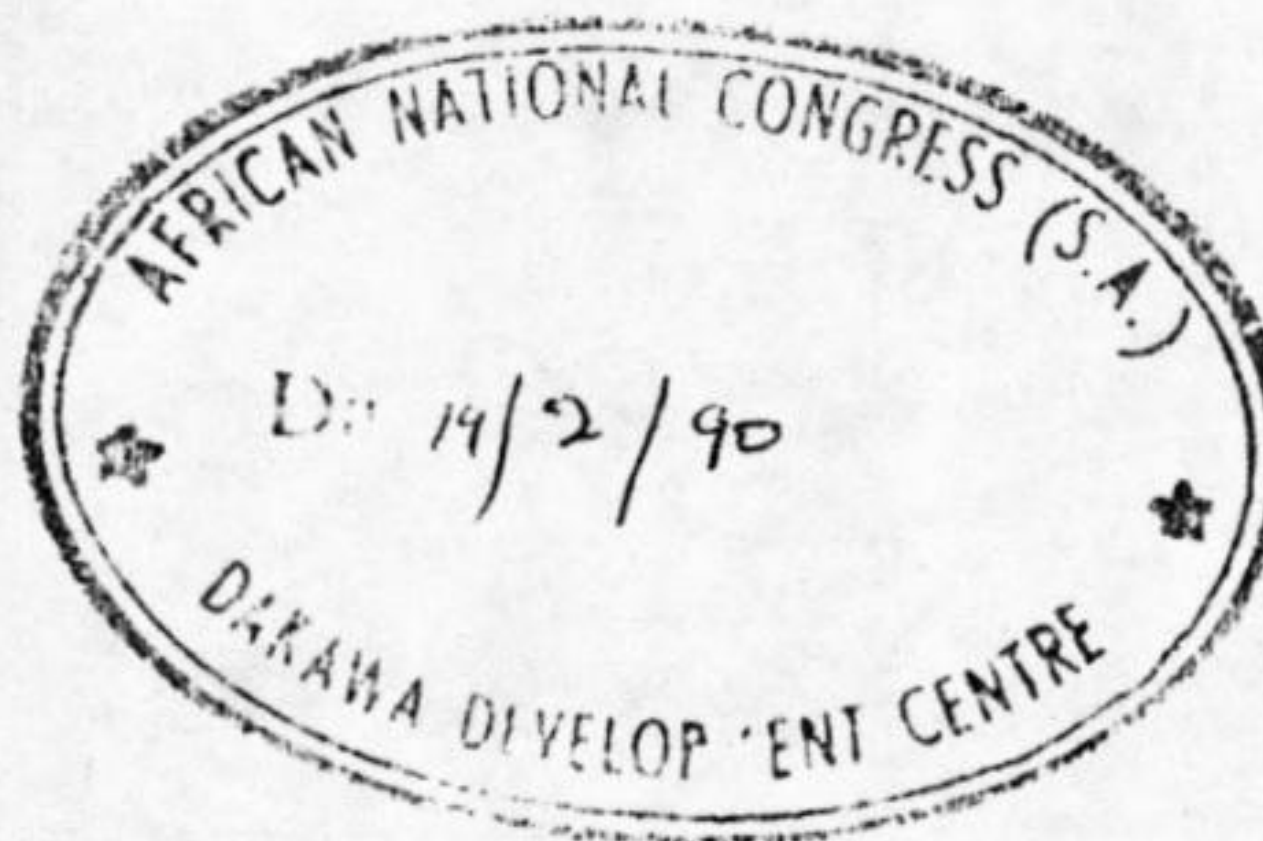
