ANC PRESS STATEMENT ON MASS ARRESTS

The South African government's national media arrests of the PAC leadership which began in true (39:51am fashion in the middle of the night. is. a travesty of justice and a violation of the democratic norms we are striving to establish in our country.

Misleadingly, and against threats to act against the government's illegitimate right of protest, raises the political temperature and is a further indication that he is not in the a minister and that he is dismissed with immediate effect.

The ANC expresses its outrage that leaders of a movement, involved in the negotiating process, should be detained, harassed and their movements offices invaded.

We draw the attention of the South African public to a pattern of systematic sabotage of the negotiating process on every occasion when it reaches a decisive moment. Each time that the negotiating process has held out the promise of a real transfer of power, action on the part of the government within the De Klerk government have backed out.

This deliberately provocative action was calculated to degenerate the negotiating process and to create an atmosphere where the radicalisation of the population can be dealt with. The National Party has again plunged the country further into a deepening crisis.
