Section 47 permits indefinite incommunicado detention without charge or triai for purposes of interrogation by the security poiice in the nominaliy independent Transkei "homeiand". Detainees held under this Act have been interrogated and tortured by Transkeian and South African security poiice. Misiie Stemeie is a field worker with the Transkei Council of Churches, and is responsible for the care of the families of detainees and poiiticai prisoners. He was previousiy detained between September 1986 and October 1987. During this period he was assaulted so badly by poiice that he required hospitai treatment. Before Misiie Stemeie was transferred to hospitai, his lawyers had made an urgent application to the Transkei Supreme Court for an order restraining the police from further assaulting him. The court application was based on an affadavit from a person who had seen him in prison with his face sw011en, allegedly after having his head hit against a wall, being beaten, and nearly suffocated and rendered unconscious by having a bag filled with water put over his head. The court granted an interim restraining order against the police. Misile Stemeie was iater charged under the TPSA with "Terrorism", but the charges were subsequently withdrawn and he was released on 6 October 1987. Foiiowing their recent arrest it is not known where Misiie Stemeie, Miimdeie Majama, Twasiie Mbandazayo or Mr Dayo are currentiy being held, nor have the Transkeian security poiice issued any statement explaining why they have been detained. Amnesty International is concerned that all four may be subjected to iii-treatment or torture.
