It is with great pleasure that I can report that the three promised sculptures by Michael Zondi are now on their way. I have railed them to you per passenger train, and (since you invited me to do so) have made the railage "to pay". you gam suply sorething better.

By way of confirming and supplementing the information telegraphed to you, the works concerned are the following:-

(1) "Rachel", 37 inches, in Red Ivory (Zulu "Ummcaka"), from my private collection. This won an award for sculpture in the first "Art South Africa Today" exhibition, Durban, 1963.

(2) EReunion", 25 inches, in Teak, from my private collection. Its elequent message has earned this sculpture particularly wide inter-

national interest.

(3) "Bathsheba", 22 inches, in Umthombothi. On your request I have persuaded the artist to release this fine work, and one of his most recent ones, and to offer it to you for sale. I have no doubt that it would grace any gallery, but the artist has given the permission that, in case you do not exercise your option, it be offered to the public. He is to have R115 for it, so you would have to adjust the

price accordingly, in case you take a commission.

This piece has so many exquisite subtleties (just to mention the enchanting treatment of the arms) that many collectors will envy you this opportunity. Rs. If sold, please make out cheque to me. grus.

I would request to have the works insured as follows: "Rachel" for R300, "Reunion" for R200, and Bathsheba" for R115.

Both "Rachel" and "Reunion" have previously been grievously damaged when I agreed to loan them for exhibition, but I am gladly sending them to you for two reasons: Firstly, I have full confidence that they are well looked after in your hands, and, secondly, I can never get over the feeling that it would be an injustice to the very spirit of creative art if I kept my collection selfishly under my own roof.
