With regard to my employment at Pioneer Press, it seems to me from the wording of the concession granted to me that I could in fact work on the premises and that I have been working under unnecessarily severe conditions. I should be immensely obliged if you could therefore, let me have specifically worded permission to work on the premises of the factory.


