It is essential that we concretely consider ways of dealing with the mobilisation of our students in various areas.

1) India

As Mosie is due to leave this area soon, it is important for us to arrange for a visit to that area before he leaves. This is preferable as he will have some understanding of the situation in that area and will also be able to give us the necessary first contacts.

I am suggesting that a trip is made in early 1978.

The purpose of the visit must be twofold;

a) to speak generally to SA students and inform them of the new situation and our needs, with the purpose of recruiting the best for activities at home.

This ~~will~~ can cover various fields, eg ^Propaganda, setting up of cells, working in any legal structures, intelligence.

b) Helping to set up some structure (in the first instance this will probably be of a very basic nature, ie., they will keep an eye on the situation, send continuous reports and inform us of any potential recruits).

2) Cairo

The individual making the trip to India can cover Egypt. While we are aware that there are at least 150 students in this area, our information about the situation is very limited. In fact we don't even know if there is a good contact already existing.

3) England

Plans have already been made to try to get a list of all students in this area. This will, at least enable us to work out some scheme for making contact.

4) Ireland

A trip by one of us, ie., known people to the area, without preparatory work does not yield much results. It is important that we must have somebody in the area who will constantly monitor the situation and we can act on the basis of these reports. I have made a contact but we must try to find others.

Kader is in a very good position and we must consider whether he cannot be asked to spend more time on this. The least we can do is initiate a long discussion with him on the whole situation in his area. He could be asked to give us some ~~idea~~ contact who we could then handle.

I am also trying to ensure that if a meeting is being organised in Ireland, either by the universities or by the AA., we should be informed so that we can use these as pretexts for being in the area.

Scotland

In general we should follow the guidelines outlined for Ireland. Hopefully Sugania will be coming to London over Christmas and this should allow us an opportunity to get some picture of the situation there.

Before MP's detach he reported that there were some "very good" Scottish comrades and we must follow this up to determine whether they can help in the other aspects of our work.

General

It is clear that in general the students come from a particular social background and while they tend to talk revolution, they are found wanting when it comes to the crunch. However it is important that through our activities we must be able to bring into our ranks every possible recruit. This can only come from a consistent activities based on a plan. I must therefore strongly recommend that in the new year we must be in a position to give a progress report on each of these areas. It is therefore essential that the trips to ~~India~~^{India} and Cairo are not delayed much longer.
