Imfundo is part of a Cambridge charity (registered charity no.
288365) and supports educational programmes for the
disadvantaged of Southern Africa. Last year we raised &80,000
from members of Cambridge University via schemes in 24 of the
31 colleges. Our funds are used in part to provide bursaries to
the university and in part to fund a wide range of
'glternative' community-based educational projects in Southern
A rice.

demonstrated by the following examples of our recent grants; we .
have contributed to a women's literacy scheme near
Johannesburg, to building classrooms in a rural school near

To date we have relied on reports from our project partners in the region for feed-back. We feel that the rapidly changing political situation in Southern Africa, the need to eValuate our past contributions, and to publicise this work to the donors in Cambridge requires a representative to visit the region.

Most of our funds are raised via students' college bills subject to the understanding that money for administration and publicity is raised separately. All the people working for the charity do so on a voluntary basis. Neither personal means nor the small amount of mdhey we currently have in our administration fund will the cover the expected costs of ezsoo for the trip. A breakdown of this sum is attached overleaf. We have already raised \$1000 in Cambridge, from churches and from the Rotary Club, leaving us a further \$1300 to find. I would be grateful to know of anyone who would be prepared to help provide some of this remaining sum. I have already approached BART, AEI, WUS, and Canon Collins.
