DISTINGUISHED TEACHERS' AWARD OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KWAZULU-NATAL

Dr Suzanne Francis



Dr Suzanne Francis is recognized for a Distinguished Teacher's Award of the University of KwaZulu-Natal for her ability to inspire students and enhance student learning. She was able to grow the curriculum in the School of Politics by creating an interest in a subject area students are not ordinarily keen on and in so doing attracted increasing numbers of both local and international students to the programmes she delivered. She engaged in a systematic review of curricular content in a way to involve and engage other lecturers in the process of review and programme design. Additionally, Dr Francis is exemplary in teaching in the School of Politics – not just teaching politics within a theoretical framework but relating it directly to issues of student life and social justice within the South African context.

Dr Francis is commended for developing curricula that are African-centred in accordance with the university's vision, mission and strategic objectives. She is recognised for the innovative methods adopted in her teaching, and the clear integrated approach and the constant re-appraising of her curriculum. The ideas she developed to enhance student learning were recognized as being very impressive as was her development of relevant teaching with nuanced debates and continual cycles of reflection and improvement which has led to its international attractiveness.

FELLOW OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KWAZULU-NATAL

Professor Ruth Elizabeth Teer-Tomaselli



Ruth Elizabeth Teer Tomaselli is an NRF Research B-Rated scholar. She has held the UNESCO Chair in Communications for Southern Africa from 2002 to the present. She is the Vice-President of the International Association for Media and Communication Research (IAMCR), the foremost international association for media scholars in the world; and an ex- President of the South African Communications Association (SACOMM).

Ruth was educated at the University of the Witwatersrand, obtaining a bachelor's degree in English and Political Science. Her Honours degree was in Development Studies, as was her Masters', focusing on Indian Flower Sellers as an example of the Informal Sector economy in Johannesburg. A change of discipline brought her into

media studies, and she obtained a doctorate from the University of Natal for her thesis exploring the SABC's television news coverage of the State of Emergency in the second half of the 1980s.

Since then, she has researched broadcasting across both radio, including community radio, and television, using a predominantly political-economy approach. Her multi-disciplinary interests are evidence in published work on memory and sense-making across generations; the history of the SABC; economics, technology and policy in broadcasting; and a large body of body on the ethos of Public Service Broadcasting. In all she has published 24 peer-reviewed articles and chapters in books, and delivered 17 peer-reviewed papers at international conferences. She has successfully supervised ten doctoral candidates and thirty-two masters students, on topics ranging from the soap operas and children's educational programming to video games and cell-phone usage.

Ruth is an editorial member of six international journals, including *Critical Arts*, *Feminist Media Review, Global Media Journal*, and *European Journal of Cultural Studies*. She was a board member and Chair of the new committee of the SABC for two terms of office; as well as serving on the boards of East Coast Radio and Durban Youth Radio.

When not reading master's dissertations, Ruth's interests are photography and gardening. She nurtures and photographs a fine collection of Bonsai trees.

HONORARY GRADUAND OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KWAZULU-NATAL

Doctor of Music (honoris causa)

Mr Bhekizizwe Joseph Shabalala



Mr Bhekizizwe Joseph Shabalala is one of South Africa's most revered musicians as well as one of the most widely celebrated around the world. He is the founder and leader of the internationally famous isicathamiya choir Ladysmith Black Mambazo, and the composer of the group's music.

Ladysmith Black Mambazo was founded in the late 1960s. A rapid succession of several 'gold' records in the mid-1970s led Mr Shabalala to decide to transform his choir into a full-blown commercial enterprise. They shot to world-wide fame after his collaboration in 1986 with US singer-songwriter Paul Simon on the legendary Graceland album. They have won three Grammy

Awards and were chosen to perform at Nelson Mandela's and FW de Klerk's joint Nobel Peace Prize ceremony in Oslo in 1993, and again at Mandela's presidential inauguration in 1994.

Through the work of his group, Mr Shabalala has pioneered far-reaching changes in a number of areas that relate to performance style. His reshaping of migrant choral music cut against the grain of some of apartheid's most entrenched mythologies – not by openly denouncing them, but by undermining their aesthetic premises. His music, primarily through the cross-linkages it maintained with umgqashiyo and mbanqanga, bridged migrant culture and township culture and thoroughly deconstructed the notion that black innovation and cultural leadership had to serve "tribal" interests and identities.

In recent years, Ladysmith Black Mambazo has collaborated with a multitude of international musicians, and a variety of South African musicians working in different styles.

Mr Shabalala has made an immense contribution to music in South Africa and has maintained consistent artistic and aesthetic achievement at the highest level.

The University of KwaZulu-Natal honours Mr Shabalala with the award of a Doctor of Music *honoris causa* for distinguished contributions to the advancement of South African music.

The Graduation Ceremony

The graduation ceremony has a long history and is steeped in tradition. It dates back to the establishment of the first universities in Europe in the 12th century.

The Chancellor

"Chancellor" is an office that goes back to Roman times: the original chancellor or *cancellarius* (as the office was known), regulated access to the Roman Tribune. In medieval times, the office became associated with the heads of writing departments of the early kings. Because so few people were literate, a chancellor was necessarily learned. This is why the heads and spokespersons of the early universities were also accorded this title. More recently the office has become largely symbolic and the executive head of a university is its Vice-Chancellor. One of the Chancellor's primary roles is to confer degrees at the graduation ceremonies.

Dr Zwelini Mkhize is the second Chancellor of the University of KwaZulu-Natal. His predecessor is Dr Frene Ginwala (2005-2009).

The Mace

The University of KwaZulu-Natal Mace was designed and executed by local sculptor Mr Zamokakhwe Gumede and is carved from an indigenous wood, Drakensberg bottlebrush (*umBande*), gathered from the artist's home near Bergville.

The head of the Mace is made up of three opened book-like forms, suggestive of scholarship but also of the massive landscape forms of our province, onto each of which is placed a ruler, a pen and a pencil. These refer respectively to the scientific and computational, the text-based and the creative sides to the University's work. Below this are an encircling set of heads, representing the diverse University community. The whole is surmounted by an alighting secretary bird (*iNtungunono*), an elegant and active bird found throughout the province and equally at home on land or in the air. At the foot of the Mace is a hoof-like shape, giving a sense of contact with the soil of Africa.

The carrying of the mace in procession symbolizes the University's status as a degree awarding institution.

Academic Dress

The wearing of gowns by judges, ministers, teachers and scholars is an ancient and significant custom. By wearing a gown when receiving their degrees and diplomas, the graduating student participates in this long tradition and joins hands with students past and present.

The hood conveys the most amount of information with the addition of braid or coloured linings differentiating the different qualifications. The colour of the band or hood lining represents the Faculty, each of which has its own colour.

Convocation

After being capped by the Chancellor, each graduate moves across the stage and hands the hood to the Robing officer who represents the Convocation of the University. The Robing officer places the hood upon the graduate's shoulders and, in so doing, symbolizes acceptance into the Convocation of the University of KwaZulu-Natal, the statutory body which links graduates of the University and through which graduates have the opportunity to play a continuing role in the affairs of the University.





The University Logo

The University Logo is a powerful visual symbol through which the University projects an image of excellence. In addition, it emphasises the University's standing and integrity within the province of KwaZulu-Natal and within the academic and business communities, at home and abroad and provides an identity around which internal stakeholders – staff and students – unite.

The African shield symbolises the protection of our most valuable assets, namely, education, culture and, by extension, African Scholarship. The globe with multi-coloured rays epitomises a rising sun, a new beginning and acts as a symbol of enlightenment.

Further, the globe represents the University as a global player, producing world-class graduates, while the multi-coloured rays embody diversity – race, culture, language – as well as social values. The book/wave/wings, which underscore the visual, represent the foundation of knowledge, the spirit of the eastern seaboard, and soaring to new heights.

The circular format of the Centenary Logo suggests unity and simulates a globe, representing UKZN as a world class university. The entire structure mirrors a coat of arms. Coats of arms are used to identify a community/family. The University is a community and 'family' within itself.

The University logo represents a University that is rooted in and responsive to Africa's unique qualities, challenges, diversities and strengths, while, at the same time, nurturing and protecting African Scholarship.

Celebrating 100 years of Academic Excellence

The University of KwaZulu-Natal (UKZN) will be celebrating 2010 as the centenary of academic excellence in the province of KwaZulu-Natal.

This marks the rich tapestry of varied history from the University College, Bechet College, Salisbury Island-University College, Medical School, Edgewood College, Pietermaritzburg, Howard College and later the University of Durban-Westville.

In January 1910, the Natal University College in Pietermaritzburg was established with 57 students – 49 men and 8 women operating from Maritzburg College.

Eight professors formed the staff of the College in 1910: Professors of Classics; Chemistry and Physics; Botany and Geology; English and Philosophy; Pure and Applied Mathematics; Zoology; Modern Languages and History; and Law. Undergraduates in 1910 paid R3.00 per month for tuition.

UKZN celebrates 100 years of consolidation of academia – we are celebrating a history of mergers, consolidations, reconfiguration and the present that we now enjoy – a university that stands out as one of South Africa's prominent universities and is one of three African universities ranked amongst the top 500 universities in the world.
