Tribute to Dave Morris

am honoured to thank Dave Morris for his service to St Andrew's School for Girls as Chair of the Board. In accordance with the constitution of the Board, he will step down at the end of this year after 6 years of service as Chair during incredibly challenging times, locally and globally.

Dave came to St Andrew's as a parent to enrol his daughter in Grade 0. He tells us that he and his wife, Precila, were enamoured with St Andrew's due to the confidence and kindness of the young student who took them on a tour of the School.

Dave was an active participant in the Parents' Association and joined the Board as a Director in 2013. His daughter, Anni, matriculated the following year and in 2015, he succeeded Stuart Thompson as Chair.

These were difficult years to steer the ship with considerable leadership challenges. In his 2015 Speech Night address, Dave said to the matrics, "Recognise the privilege you have and use it wisely and to the full."

He was enthusiastic about seeing women "taking a more prominent role in society". The fact that we will have the first woman Chair of the Board in 2022 is no doubt a result of Dave's leadership and influence.

Two gifts that I have experienced with Dave as Chair is his ability to be fully *present* and to *listen*. These are essential leadership skills. He encouraged our matrics (and I quote), "to stand up when you see people being wronged, support them when they do good … speak up when your voice needs to be heard."

Dave has always been an advocate of inclusion. He said in 2017, "We are continually trying to open channels to listen to the contribution the girls have to make ... and believe me, what they have to say is really worth listening to".

The philosophy of inclusion has resulted in two things in my experience:

- Our head girl and deputies have had a presence and a voice at our Board meetings
- 2. Our Board meetings have been really LONG but worthwhile!


Under Dave's watch, in 2015 the Board approved the extension of the School Hall, the installation of a generator, the upgrading of the IT infrastructure, the overdue construction of new single staff accommodation and the building of the Dinaledi Science Centre.

In 2019, St Andrew's became a 'candidate' member of Round Square, which offers world-class programmes and experiences that develop global competence, character and confidence in our girls. This speaks of Dave's passion for education that is globally relevant as well as his concern for the environment and the awareness of climate change.

In 2017, Dave quoted Professor David Orr in Ecological Literacy:

"The plain fact is that we do not need more successful people. But we do desperately need more peacemakers, healers, restorers, storytellers and lovers of every kind. We need people who live well in their places. We





need people of moral courage, willing to join the fight to make the world habitable and humane."

Dave's foresight of the need for a well-articulated vision for our School led to the Board's approval of the Six Strategic Visions.

In 2020, the Board faced particular challenges due to the Coronavirus pandemic. Dave said, "We have responded to these circumstances in a way which I believe will take us to a new and better place and one where the School is stronger and more resilient."

He thanked the staff for their commitment, dedication and support for St Andrew's in responding to Covid-19 so well.

The School also responded to the need for change indicated by testimonies from current and past students about prejudice and racism. Dave engaged with the young alumnae and invited the whole community to be part of a '3-ear' listening approach.

He said, "It is my wish that in the future, some Old Girls ten years hence will be able to provide testimony and stories which reflect their school years as being inclusive, full of enjoyment and fulfilment and without lived experience of racism of any sort."

In my tenure at St Andrew's so far, I am indebted to our Chair. He became a mentor and confidante. Thank you, Dave, for the heart you have for the people of St Andrew's and for humankind.

66 Recognise the privilege you have and use it wisely and to the full.

Besides his contribution as Chair, Dave works with Symphonia SA, an organisation developing leadership skills through partnering business leaders with public school heads. He assists an orphanage called Home of Hope for Girls through teaching self-sufficiency. An example of this is the girls are now producing their own honey.

Lastly, coming from an engineering and business background, Dave shares his innovation and creativity through Umoya, a social enterprise that designed a respiratory product born out of the Covid need.

Dave truly exemplifies servant leadership. We are deeply grateful for the blessing he has been for St Andrew's.

Executive Head's Address

here was a turning point of hope this year with the official opening of the Dinaledi Science Centre, one year and one term after its completion, on time and on budget, which was a fantastic achievement.

Although attendance numbers at the opening were limited due to Covid restrictions, it was

such a wonderful evening of celebration with our community.

Dinaledi means 'Stars' in Sesotho, Sepedi and Setswana. The site chosen replaced the old accommodation site for our support staff and their new accommodation was built alongside the existing residences. The architect, Mark Schaerer, spoke about why the architecture is different from the rest of St Andrew's buildings, positioning the purpose of the building into the future, which is aligned with our transformation journey.

Our student head of the Environmental Task Team, Zahra Karan, spoke about the environmentally conscious features of the building, which included the rooftop vegetable garden with its own irrigation and solar panels. Former Executive Head of St Andrew's, Pauline Jackson, was asked to open the centre. Mrs Jackson was a muchloved leader at St Andrew's for 10 years and was also an excellent Science teacher.

Just ahead of the opening, we received a magnificent statue called 'Become', which was placed next to the centre. It talks to the potential growth of all our students becoming 'Dinaledi' (stars) and to women who have been so under-represented in the STEM fields finding their voices. May this piece of artwork, created by a woman artist, achieve its aim of transforming everyone who comes into our

bloom take your breath away with their carpet of purple. As the end



Valedictory

Ok, I'm just going to say it. I love you all. You are sensational. You enrich my life. Did that rattle a few of you? Did it make you squirm a little? Feel a little uncomfortable?

For the record, it's true. And I really shouldn't feel so embarrassed for saying it out loud. On this stage. In front of everyone. But I do. And that has everything to do with how we express self-love as well as appreciation and unconditional love for the people around us.

Earlier this year, when we gifted the outgoing Matrics with a little something to wish them well for the exams, we decided to focus on a wellness theme. A self-love theme. There were any number of reasons why this seemed right and appropriate for 2021; well, just being 2021 was reason enough! But we'd seen the strain on the Matrics as a result of the disruption caused by COVID and the lockdowns, by the social distancing restrictions, as well as the general tension and uncertainty hanging in the air.

When we handed over these gifts - as a celebration and acknowledgement of this important rite of passage - we chose to share with the Class of 2021 a profound speech delivered by word artist, Adam Roa. It was a stirring moment, and one that enabled us, as alumnae, to impart one of the most important lessons that any young woman can learn: You are enough. Or, as Roa put it: "You are who you've been looking for."

Unfortunately too many girls, too many women, continue to battle with this simple truth. We confuse self-love with a monthly massage or treating ourselves to a new pair of shoes. But it's more than that, it's about boundaries, selfrespect, about cutting out negative self-talk, and - to quote Roa again - "treating yourself like someone you love".

Just a few months back, the news was filled with the testimony of a remarkable whistleblower, Frances Haugen, who had the self-belief, self-confidence and self-assurance to stand up to a juggernaut like Facebook. Among the revelations which came out of her disclosures was the fact that the way Facebook's Instagram platform was wired to cause depression and eating disorders in many young women. This is because the algorithms coded into our social media experiences are designed to feed our fears. This makes these platforms largely - but not exclusively - toxic for many young women already battling the feelings of uncertainty that come with growing up in a complex modern world.

I'm here today, as a woman, and as an Old Girl, to tell each and every one of you that you are enough. You are good enough. You are sensational. And never let anyone - or any algorithm for that matter - tell you differently.

You can combat this miasma of toxicity by being kind to yourself. By being your own cheerleader through life. By prioritising your needs. By trusting your gut instinct. By surrounding yourself with positive and supportive people. And by giving yourself permission to make mistakes. That last one, I can tell you, is hard.

For our Matric class of 2021, who will leave this Valedictory Service as newly-minted 'Old Girls', and who are being propelled forward by ambitions and goals and all sorts of wonderful dreams for the future, I urge you to use the St Andrew's community as a haven from the toxicity of the world out there.

When you are in doubt, lean on us. When you find yourself being harsh about missteps or agonising through decision, remember where you have come from. Hold onto the values of this remarkable school and its people. Remember the privilege and responsibility that each and every one of us has enjoyed as a member of this family.

Above all, value yourself. Love yourself. Know vourself. And let your dreams guide you to a remarkable tomorrow.

Class of 2021, the stage is now yours. Go out there and shine. Make the world a better place, a kinder place, a more just and dignified place for all. And do it with love and acceptance in your heart. Since poetry has been the order of the day, I'm going to turn to one of our own South African talents, poet and activist, Lebo Mashile, to provide the right words for this inspiring occasion:

You and I We are the keepers of dreams We mould them into light beams And weave them into life's seams.

Transformation and Diversity

he Transformation and Diversity Committee has had a really meaningful year, as it has been with other past years. Covid-19 remained a challenge in 2021 and yet the Transformation and Diversity Committee Members were able to connect with each other to meet as required. This year saw the completion of the Transformation and Diversity Policy, as well as the Anti-Racism Policy. These policies were shared with the community and include procedures for students and staff for reporting incidences of racism and discrimination. Whilst these policies remain working documents, they will provide much-needed clarity and transparency for the community at large and we thank our community for their input in the crafting of these important documents.

Heritage Day is often a special and exciting day for community members at St Andrew's. This year was no different. Our schools celebrated this day by donning their exquisite traditional attire as well as bringing food to share. A message of lifelong learning and empathy around what qualifies one's sense of belonging formed part of the discussions around Heritage Day with the students and staff.

The True Andrean (student-led body) acknowledged Pride Month by raising the Pride Flag on our school campus as a symbolic gesture to those on our campus who identify with this community. The students raised money through selling of Pride badges and hosting a "Spray-a-Thon". The funds raised will go to a youth shelter for members of the LGBTQIA+ community.

The Employment Equity Committee and the Human Resources Department have been working tirelessly this year in crafting the Employment Equity Plan in line with the Employment Equity Act. The Human Resources Department focused on Recruitment, Skills Development and Human Resource Administration and Policies to address inequalities for fair labour practices.

Staff development remains a key component in our Transformation journey and during the year, staff participated in workshops that were aimed in bringing awareness of the role of one's identity and agency in the teaching space. Staff unpacked the creation of knowledge and the lens in which we teach.

It is of paramount importance to us that we take the lessons learnt in the testimonials written by past and present students. With this in mind, we invited each current student who courageously shared their stories. Our aim in the engagements was to provide feedback as well as to highlight the value each story brought to our transformation journey learnings. The voices of our students are important to us and we trust that this process validated their stories as we continue to learn and up-skill our staff so they, too, can become agents of change in their space.

The Transformation and Diversity Committee welcomed the new Head of Transformation, Sheillah Muchauraya. She takes over from Siphiwe Vilakazi, who has undoubtedly set a solid foundation for the school in this role. We thank Siphiwe for his contribution during his tenure and acknowledge the integral role he played in ensuring the School's ability to navigate a tumultuous year. Siphiwe will continue supporting Sheillah in her role until the end of the year and will remain a valued member of the Transformation Committee. Sheillah joins the team also as a committee member of the recently launched SATISA (South African Transformation for Independent Schools Association) whose duty is to inform best practice, regulate, build capacity and encourage collaboration within the transformation space.

In order to ensure that as many diverse voices are included in our next step in our journey, we will be hosting 'Think Tank Sessions' around the four main themes that were highlighted in the survey results. These working groups will commence in the New Year.

In closing, I would like to applaud the Transformation and Diversity Committee members, different task team members of the Committee from different schools of thoughts, and the Employment Equity Committee Members for their commitment and passion throughout the year.

66 Hope is the thing with feathers -That perches in the soul -And sings the tune without the words -And never stops - at all. 99

EMILY DICKINSON.

n the poem, there are two words that stand out. The first being 'Hope', that is metaphorically transformed into a strong-willed bird that lives within the human soul - and sings its song no matter what.

Hope is the bird that sings come rain or shine, gale or storm, good times or bad.




