.Dear Mr. Mvusi,

Thank you very much for the project proposal concerning the erection of steel constructions at the Kangwane School Project.Kangwane seems to be a very appropriate project to benefit from the remaining resources of the previous ANC schools in Tanzania. I only have one remark concerning the actual project proposal. It concerns the structures for One small machinery hall which was brought to Tanzania together with the rest do not seem to be included in the proposal. According to Mr. Nordbo the structures are still to be found in Tanzania. Kindly explain.

I have been trying to get in contact with you in Dar Es Salaam through NPA and TCRS without Success. Yesterday I called your Johannesburg office no success either. I would like to discuss the various possibilities concerning the project.

.I share your concern that implementing the transfer of steel structures may be a daunting task particularly from a logistical point of view.

In your fax of 13 January 1993 you suggest that a Tanzanian consortium takes over the structures against 'supplying and erecting' a similar structure in South Africa. I assume that means that the amount a sale of the structures would bring in then would be transferred to South Africa for use in the Kangwane project.

It is indeed an interesting proposal. In order to pursue this further we would need solid information on the parties and the actual transactions involved, and 1f agreed upon possibly a partner in Tanzania e.g. TCRS to oversee the transactions on behalf of Danchurchaid.

This is crucial in order for DCA and DANIDA to get an idea of the costs involved. This was already mentioned in my letter of October 21, 1993 addressed to Mr. Tikly. In view of the logistics involved in the original proposal to transfer the structures DCA would prefer above arrangement if all transactions can be assured and documented. If this option for one reason or the other would turn out to be inappropriate we would then still need of cost estimates related to a possible shipment of the steel structures. . I believe that there is a great need for all parties involved to reach an agreement soonest possible. I appreciate the work that has been done already knowing it is very time consuming.
