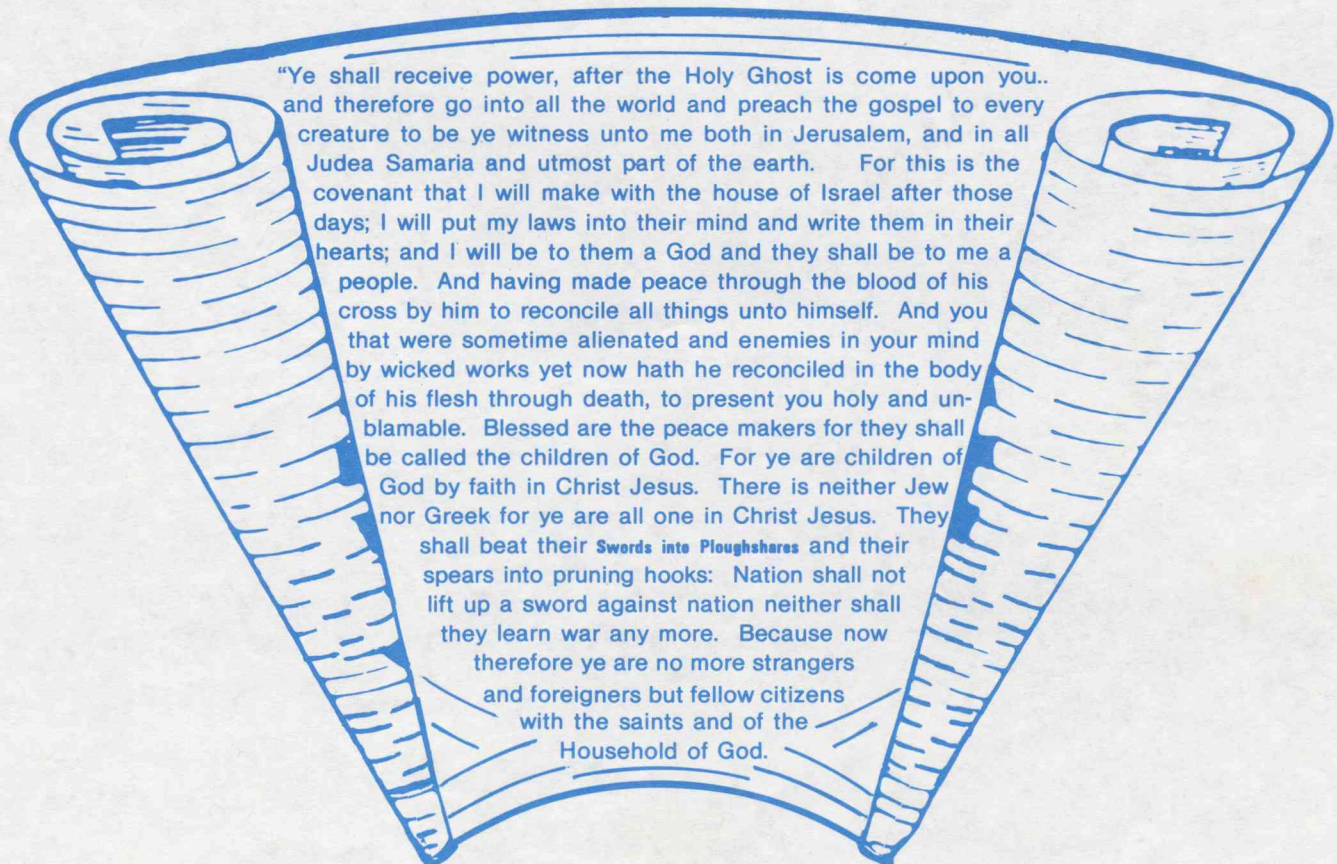




SIP INTERNATIONAL BULLETIN

We hope to be graced by eminent leaders in Government, Church and the business community.

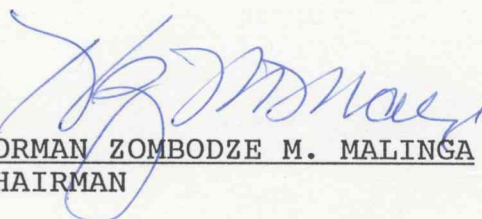
This year's theme is A NATION IS ONE FAMILY UNDER GOD

COMMEMORATION OF DECEMBER 14TH

THE PRINCE OF PEACE DAY FOR SOUTHERN AFRICA

WHAT THIS COMMEMORATION IS ABOUT

This get together by Christians of every denomination, government, business and community leaders on this special day is an effort to highlight the fact that true peace can only come about through Jesus Christ the Prince of Peace. He imparts wisdom and sound leadership when the Christian body intercedes for those in authority. It is a time of giving of thanks with leadership in Government, Church and business.

Background to the December 14th Event

It was after the International Community had spent over 35 years trying to solve numerous World crisis among them the problem of decolonization and self-determination of the peoples of Southern Africa that a decision was taken to seek a direct Divine supernatural intervention of His Majesty the King of Kings in the World Peace process. Each year thousands upon thousands of lives were subjected to bloodshed and many lives were lost in the efforts of seeking liberty and democracy for the Southern Africa Region. To many people it became clear that this problem was defying solution.

The then Ambassador of Swaziland to the UN's Christian experience convinced him that what was needed to break the impasse was a divine intervention of the Prince of Peace. Reasoning had failed. A superior power capable of influencing the collective will of people to effect change and reconciliation was needed. As an effort to confront that tragic situation in the region of Southern Africa, a prayer luncheon was then organised on December 14th, 1983 in the United Nations Delegates Dining Hall. It was attended by the Secretary General of the United Nations, the President of the General Assembly, the chairman of the Security Council, Ambassadors from all geographic regions and the Liberation movements. The church leadership ministered in prayer. The following prayer was made by Rev. Clinton Utterbach of Redeeming Life Christian Centre in New York:

"Therefore I exhort First of All
That supplications prayers,
Intercessions and giving of
thanks be made for all men for
Kings and for all those who are

in authority that we may lead a
quiet and peaceful life in all
godliness and reverence.
For this is good and acceptable
in the sight of God Our Saviour
Who desires that all men to be saved
And to come to the knowledge of
the truth
For there is one God and one
mediator between God and Men and
the Man Christ Jesus"

The Church in South Africa was represented by Pastor Ray MacCaulley who flew all the way from South Africa. Today he is one of the churchman who plays an active conciliatory role in new South Africa's peace development process.

Development in the World and the Region since that Historic December 14, 1983.

For many years the body of Christ was more involved in intercessory prayers through out the World and in Southern Africa in particular, with the following dramatic results:

- Eastern bloc countries experienced dramatic changes. The Church had been interceding for decades.
- 1984 Southern Africa Church man Bishop Tutu awarded a Nobel Peace Prize.
- 1989 Namibia received its independence her first Foreign Minister had participated in the December 14 Prince of Peace Lunch.
- 1990 South Africa democratic process announced.
- Rustenburg Church Conference was a scene of dramatic reconciliation between the black and white people of South Africa.
- President De Klerk appointed a group of churchmen as his advisors on constitutional development.
- President Mugabe's policy of National Reconciliation became a reality.
- Peace realized in Angola.
- Peace initiatives are in progress in Mozambique.
- Zambia went through a peaceful transition. Churches in Zambia were opened for 24 hours during the election month.

The Prince of Peace Day for Southern Africa

December 14th is a date to be always remembered. The body of Christ in the Region and the people of Southern Africa must be

told and must know that on that date the international community sought the God of Heaven for the solution of the problems of the region.

The road is not easy. The Church should continue to intercede for the leadership of the region so that God may grant them wisdom to solve the difficulties facing them. The Somalia, Sudan and Ethiopia tragedy, the drought situation in Southern Africa are problems that must be brought before the Lord. The people of God must pray to the father of mankind to unite His family. Practical life saving assistance should be intensified to save disaster areas of Somalia, Ethiopia and drought stricken Southern Africa.

What is the Swords Into Ploughshares International and What are its Objectives

The SIP International is not a mass church movement which recruit members to join. It is a rather low keyed non-denominational outreach. It consists of a group of seven dedicated men of God from different denominations. They intercede for leadership and encourage the body of Christ to be involved in various events that uphold the name of the Prince of Peace. Its formation was inspired by the UN Prayer luncheon of 1983. It could be seen as a follow-up catalytic peace task force with the following objectives:

- 1) To build bridges of peace, friendships and fellowship among a divided peoples and nations on the basis of Christian principles and values;
- 2) To promote, in the name of the Prince of Peace Jesus, peace and reconciliation among peoples and nations;
- 3) To facilitate peace, friendship and fellowship by organising activities and international events that are consistent with the principles of the Prince of Peace.
- 4) To undertake Christian oriented human resource development programmes;
- 5) To cultivate Christian principles and virtues in the business community;
- 6) To cultivate an enabling environment conducive to the promotion of the quality of life more in particular to those who find themselves in economic disadvantaged situations and those whose family life has been disrupted and continue to suffer violence and terror because of internal or external politically inspired destabilisation campaigns.
- 7) To prepare a divided peoples and Nations for the second coming of the Peace of Peace to establish His government.
