CAB/LEG/61.8/93/Vol.I dated 17 September, 1998 informing them of the postponement of the proposed Ministerial Conference on Human Rights in Africa which was scheduled for 26-30 October, 1998, in pursuance of resolution CM/Res.1673 (LXIV) adopted by the Council of Ministers during its 64th Ordinary Session held in Yaounde, Cameroon, from I to 5 July, 1996.

In this connection, the General Secretariat wishes to inform all Member States that the said Ministerial Conference will now be held in Grand Baie. Mauritius, from 25 to 29 January, 1999. The Conference will be structured follows:

25 to 26 January:

Meeting of Government Legal Experts

27 January:

28 to 29 January:

Ministerial Meeting.

The General Secretariat wishes to underline the importance of this Conference bearing in mind that the resolution of the Council of Ministers referred to above recognized and reiterated "the importance of promoting, protecting and respecting human rights as essential factors in the preservation of peace and stability on the continent". Furthermore, although the Conference is taking place in 1999, it should be recalled that it had initially been hoped that this Conference would serve as a manifestation of Africa's contribution to the commemoration of the 50th Anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which is being celebrated worldwide this year.

The draft agenda for the proposed Ministerial Conference is attached hereto for information. Regarding the logistical arrangements for the Conserence, the General Secretariat has the honour to inform the esteemed Ministries as follows:
