

Sister Bernard Ngcube and I met Barry Smith yesterday and gave him a briefing on the developments at KWSC since March 14, 1992. Inter alia, we reported on the legal action we are preparing to take and said that a meeting of donors will be held on 4/6/92. Interfund expressed satisfaction about the measures we are taking to remove the squatting students and to restrain C. Seaposengwe and the Parents Committee from further interference in the Project.

In response to our request for the release of further funds to meet pressing needs, Barry Smith said that Interfund is not holding any balance for distribution at present, but that applications made by YET to Denmark, Canada and Norway had been approved but not processed as yet.

However, Interfund will not be able to release any funds to YET unless there is assurance about the viability of the project and the following issues will have to be addressed by YET:

1. How much damage has the illegal student occupation done and how will this affect the Project?
2. Will legitimate students return?
3. Will the support of the Kangwane Authority and the local community remain?
4. Will there be a competent management established to run the Project?
