* Background and purpose:

The Potchefstroom University for Christian Higher Education, through the Institute for Reformational Studies, has for the past fifteen years established excellent relationships with academics and tertiary educational institutions in Africa. Since 1975 thirteen conferences have been held at which African countries from all over the continent were represented. The last conference with the theme A Future South Africa in the African Context, was held on 31 July 1991 and speakers from West, East, Central and Southern Africa took part in the proceedings.

In the light of the mission of the Potchefstroom University for Christian Higher Education it was decided, by making use of the existing relationships and contacts the University has in Africa, to utilise its facilities and expertise in order to establish a dual partnership with countries in Africa, including Southern Africa.

By hosting a Pan-African Conference from 27 April to 1 May 1992, which will represent the highlight of fifteen years of sustained interaction with Africa, the Potchefstroom University for Christian Higher Education aims to bind and expand these valuable and much appreciated relationships inter alia by the following actions:

During the first four days of the Conference the present transformations in Africa will be discussed as well as ways and means whereby this process of transformation can be encouraged (see main theme). Topical issues related to this transformation (see subthemes) as well as the position of South Africa will also be addressed.

Prominent speakers and respondents, as well as carefully selected participants representative of as many as possible Anglophone African Countries, will ensure that a high level of theoretical reflections as well as practical soberness will be maintained.

The last day of the Conference will be used to establish an African Chapter of the International Association for the Promotion of Christian Higher Education in order to enable individuals and institutions to cooperate more closely in academic and other related matters in the future.
