Frnm Bource: within government circles and the ANC55 Intelligence Department. MAYIBUYE has unearthed a chilling two-prmnged plan of the NP regime for the transition.

Operation Thunderatmrm and Operatiun Springbok. Thege are the ofticial mamas of the reqimeis two-pronqed strategy to thwart democracy. Wurkad nut to deal with the most-February 1?9Q oeriad. the final aim is to force the ANC into an entrenched coalition with. at least. the NP.

Operation Springbok i5 complex. but simply stated. it aims to prevent the ANC frum torming a government an its own. Normally thia wauld not be aimistar. It wauld he 4air competition where a party strives ta attain maximum advantage in a demacratic dispensation.

The di44arence in thia Case is the existence 0% Operation Thunderstorm. A5 its name suggement. this operation seeks to devastate the country in 1t5 hPWake. It is meant to wreak havoc in order to force the ANC to accept hOmeration Springbmkn

Describing the core mf Operation Thunderstorm. a seniar nfficial 96 the ANC Intelligence Department says: "Every plan and action. particularly on the que\$tion of violence. is aimed at weakening the ANC so that it is eventually torced into a constitutional coalitium. At the heart of the plan is the NP goal ta be the main partner in a future QDVEFhmEHt. cmntralling all levers of power. particularly the armv. police and intelligence." The process of change. acaording to NP calculations, should he controlled. cantained and regulated by the government. This is with the understanding that the status quo. with limited adjugtments. would remain intact and protected.

Dwewatiah Thundergtorm is designed to weaken the ANC physically through violence and create a climate of uncertainty. The unbanning of the ANC and the release of its leaders wauld then aopear. in the eyes of blacks in particular. as the cause at their terrible suffering. Actording to the plan. When the NP #inally forces the ANC into a coalition. the peanle wmuld only be ten happy ta see an and to the violence even if their aocinhpolitical conditions are not addressed. mumm .

The whole upirotion to pilot Thunderstorm was left in the hands of the Department at Militarv Intelligence (DMI). The National Intelligence Service (NIB) was informed about the operation but does not carry out any ground operations. Sources that have been in contact with the oovornment on security matters allege that it is prepared to discuss most arms of the South African Defence Force. but presently it will not brook any discussions on the DMI.

The most astonishing factor is that NIB. 4 body responsible for domestic and Foreign intelligence. has apparently not tabled a report on its findings about the causes o\$ the violence and the highly unstable conditions in the country.

"There is no way that NIS can sav that it hes not investigated the highly volatile situation. Neither can it cook up a runort that exonerate: the DMI. the police and the army. N18 is composed of supposedly intelligent people who know that they could never put together a plausible story about he present situation without burning their fingers in the process. Their imple solution has 'been to present no report." says one intelligence 17151 der 1

But a report was presented to the State President concerning the role of the security forces in the violence. according to one MAYIBUYE source. It contained NIS's assessment of the allegatione that the security forces were behind the violence. The report was never made public. ELEMENTS OF THUNDERSTURM

The main strategy of Operation Thunderstorm is to unleash violence using secret networks of the DMI and the "tormer" Security Branch of the SAP. This is backed by intensive anti-ANC propaganda involving: X Blaming the ANC and particularly Umhhonto we Sizwe for the violence. This would also include a deliberate camoaion of character assassination directed against selected ANC leaders. 3PK Fomehting divisions within the ANC and the alliance by trying to isolate the South African Communist Party and saucelled radical ANC elements. especially the Youth League. On the other hand. efforts would be made to portray the regime's response to violence positiVely. For this purpose. the South African Broadcasting Corporation and the regimels network in the printed media would stand it in good stead. In this way. the high-hahded actions of the SAP and SADF as well as their lack of resolve in deeling with ooponents of the AND accused of violent crimes would receive as little criticism as possible. Other measures envisaged as the plan matures are:

t gelective arrests of cadres of the RNC and its allies: and

 $\boldsymbol{x}$  possible restriction of newsmapehs highly critical of the government.

The (irst and most important phase at Operation Thunderstorm has long been in operation. This is reflected partly in the support given to activities of organisations like Inketha. Another aspect is the erming and deployment of criminal gangs, agent provocateurs. Askeris. Renameq Koevoet and others. The aim is to unleash random violence in black areas in order to dissuade people from openly supporting the ANC. For this purpose, both hit squads and armed bands from hostels are used.

As a result. a number of these general: and same senior NP leaders tind the temptatiOn to resort to more repression difficult to resist. The reCent call-up and De Klerk's threat to declare a state of emergehcy reflect this tendency.

hat is alea alarming are the Bill: that the NP has rushed through erliement. The Hill which will allnw the regime to tap telephones and violate privacy is directed primarily at the ANC and its allies. "Recent exposures of its activities and plans by newspaper: have gent shock wave: about the intelligence capacity of the eppoeitian. The regime new aims to neutralise and deetabiliee this threat." say: an intelligence source. Related to thie are 81119 an "direct end indirect intimidation". SADF conscription, detention without trial and sabcalled private armies. Can Fw de Klerk credibly claim not to know? No One outside the highest gevernment circles seems to be privy te what the N19 report submitted to the State President contains.

But even it NIS chose to fudge the issues. the reality 19 that Operation Thundereterm. in its sheer scale. funding and political objective (Operation Springbok). could not imaginebly be conducted without at least the tacit involvement and knawledge of the head of state.

How Operation Thunderstorm works

rapewetion Thunderstorm aims to rent the idea of "blackeonwblack violence" in lecal and international public epinion.

Rendnm ehnotinge. which appear not to be linked to any political rivalry. form part 04 this strategy. To contuee matters ferther. the professionel hit-Squads are provided with arms 0% Soviet origin. weapons previously aesociated with the AND. The train and vigil messaCree and. more recently. the murder of 18 people on the eve of June 15 are an example. All the murders were random and the police were quick to let that fact sink in. 04 the structures used in Operation Thunderstorm. remnants Of the COB and others are eupposed to act "independently". They also operate within Inkatha Freedem Party. Then there are Battalions 31 and 32 (mainly Angelan mercenaries), Reece 5 (mainly hoznmbicane). Keevoet (Namihiens) and Reece 3 (farmer Rhodeeians).

Training and eupport for elements within Inkatha and criminal gangs is crucial fer the operation. Inkethagate and other revelations about the cmllaboretion of DMI. COB. Inkathe and the KwaZulu Police in the Mkhuze training camp and other activities in the Eastern and Western Transvaal are only the tip 04 the iceberg, says a security operative. Tani wars in the Western Cape. Transvaal and other areas also form part 04 this strategy.

In the PNV. huetele such as Mztmhldphe. Alexandra, Mndala. Nhlezene, Jeppe. Denver and Thokoza are used ae barracks and training centres. They also eat me place: 94 retreat 4dr #orces that have attacked townships. With otticiel uehctien. many former occupant! of hoetels have been driven out ta be replaced by people who are oberativee of Operation'Thunderstorm. A number of Judge: and human rights gruupe have protested at the release of ucomman criminals" lung beiare their jail term: expire. Sources within the security eatebliehment say the reasen is not difficult to find: many of them have been recruited ta take part in the violence. The operation elem reliea heavily an infiltrating agent: into AND structures. "The amaunte of money and other perks. including cnre. premised some of the agents have been regularly increased." says an AND security operative. Depending on the location of an agent, their brief. include the gathering at general intelligence and uphratianel information of immediate use in the violence as well as provocative actions aimed at discrediting the ANC. A special and very small DMI unit has been assigned to operate within and antral the activities of the extreme right-wing. "Because at the unreliability of same elements in the rightewing. the selection and recruitment Of persons to pilmt the right-wing campaign of terror Ihd intimidation is considered as primary." says an AND eeniar intelligence aftieer. "By keeping some right-wing armed groups operational and their activities regulated, the regime would be able to force the ANC to accept the inevitability of a coalition with the NP."

Opspoor en Uitwisyf

The Nmrthern Transvaal Plan

Ae part at Thunderstorm. a special plan #or the Northern Transvaal has been worked out. One hf its central themes is "Dpspoor en uitwis van vyandelihe strukture" CTracking dawn and eliminating enemy structures). It is esSentielly beeed en the approach bf the Joint Management System. The plan involves examining the governmentis own fereee in this area and selecting individuale ta be given specific leadership tasks.

- .19 unit is to be car- has been created to mobilise the force necessary te carry out the plan. Propaganda is at the centre of the strategy, and it include; controlling media reports to discredit "radical" organisations. The plan Aims to influence the pbpulatiOh as follows:
- # Infiltratiun Of "enemy structures" to help eliminate them. Special targets will be the ANC. "radical" church leaderu. trade unionists. wmrkere' utructures in factories. etc.
- # Play the "Cherteriste" (ANC) eqeinet the Black Cunecieuenese groupinge and tmment ethnic tensions.
- x Select certain coloured and Indian leaders from all levele ef society business. religion. education. sports and medlcine and cunvince them that the aovernment is right and realistic and that their tuture lies with the NP.
- X Create a climate in which pru-NP farce: In Lehowa and Bazankulu can Operate freely.

MAYIBUYE enurCee are unable to enplain why this particular region has been singled Out. "We can only surmise that the strength of the extreme right-wing might have led to its eelectiun as a pilot area." says an intelligence analyet. "However, the plan is applicable in any part of the country."
