RE: USA DELEGATIONS
Between the dates of 19-21 October 1991, two delegations are due
to be in South Africa as guests of the ANC:

1.

Arriving on commercial flights will be 15 to 20 African
American leaders representing a wide spectrum of sectors,
organisations. etc.: Labour, Governor of Virginia, mayors,
congress, civil rights, women, youth, churches, etc.
We requested a summit-type meeting with ANC leadership to
strategise on future cooperation. They will be coming to
get their marching orders from us. We should see a
relationship between Rev. Walter Fauntroy, Africare and
this leaderships decision, to continue mobilising
resources for us. The President's office confirmed let for
the meeting.

Arriving by chartered jet will be prominent USA artists,
performers - cultural workers. They will be here to show
solidarity with ANC and the people of South Africa. They
should see apartheid in graphic terms, Alexandra, Soweto
for example.

We expect this to be a big media event as these artistsl
responses must be reported. worldwide. ANC will discuss
needs for transformation and reconstruction. Perhaps a big
rally could be used to present them to our people in
recognition of their participation in our struggle.

We will want them to decide on a mega fund raising event like the one done for drought stricken parts of Africa by USA Aid for Africa. Our design is to engage them in an event that can raise at least \$100 million if we handle this properly. We hope a committee involving DAC can be formed as soon as possible.

Again, October let was booked on the Presidentis calendar for a reception for the artists.

This again is complementary to the other efforts that were discussed in the last two weeks with Fauntroy and Africare. Although we are informing/inviting the artists already, a letter from our President will go a long way to securing the best that we want to target. We submitted a draft that needs to be signed.
