BUDGET PROPOSAL FOR AFRICAN NATIONAL CONGRESS

DONORS CONFERENCE

ARUSHA, TANZANIA. 3 -95 FEBRUARY, 1990

Background

The African National Congress (SA) as the major Liberation Movement in South. Africa has over the past few decades . established a vast network of projects in exl'le to cater for the educational, training, social, health, agricultural and other needs of its membership based externally. Apart from contributing to the organisations aim of achieving self rellance these projects have provided experience in creating alternative institutions in preparation for Tiberation. This has been possible, largely, thanks to the selfless assistance of the International Community.

It became imperative that the organisation pay attention to streamTining the assistance it receives from the InternationaT Community as well as seeking further assistance to cater for new arrivaTs.

In 1989 the ANC took a decision to convene a major Donors Conference in October, 1990. The Conference was to concentrate malnly on issues pertaining to the two largest ANC settTements ln exiTe - the Mazimbu/Somafco Schoot Projects and the Dakawa . DeveTopment Centre, both in Tanzania.

The unbanning of the African National Congress in February, 1990 brought about a new situation in the struggle against apartheid. The ANC has begun to reiccate many of its administrative and political structures inside South Africa and to recons-ltute 'tself as a Tegal organisation.

In Apri: 1990 the Natlonal Executive Committee issued a 90 e Statement on ANC Projectstwhich stated that "there needs t. be a CTear indication that the poTiticaT changes taking plac In South Africa are Irreversible. Untll such a point has been reached, the movement Wlll continue to bear responsibility for its membership ..." It went further to point out that there are compelling reasons for the contined existence of external projects, especiaTTy in relation to human resource development. Therefore the ANC - NEC took a firm decision to continue with projects externaTTy and to proceed with the Donors Conference as pTanned.

The period since the unbanning of the ANC has vindicated this approach. An escaTation in the poTiticaTTy motivated violence in SA and the continued denial of educational opportunities to the majority of South Africans has Ted to a new infTux of hundreds of victims of apartheid into the ANC's settTements. During 1989/90 the African NationaT Congress her a series of consuTtations with the Mass Democratic Movement, community based organisations, indigenous South African NGO's and project honers on issues pertaining to funding, to development poTicy and strategy and, in particular, to the role of projects in the deveTopment process. The recommendations of these consultations form the background for the ANCs approach to the Donors Conference which is pianned For 3-5 February, 1991 at the Arusha Conference Centre in Tanzania.

The Conference

The ANC Donors Conference will be attended by approximateTy 200 representatives of governmentaT and non-governmentaT organisations from Europe, North America, Asia, the Pacific and Africa. The bulk of these organisations have been invoived for many years in assisting the victims of Apartheid. The ANC/MDM participants, who number 80 peopleg comprise of representatives of a cross section of the ANC structures and SA NGOs invoived in deveTopment work, representatives of project honers from SA on a sectoraT basis and 19 ANC Chief Representatives abroad. The objectives of the ANC Donors Conference are to:-

- -discuss a strategic approach to development
- -present programme and project priorities
- -soiicit funding from donors
- -discuss mechanisms and structures for coordination of projects and funding

The Doncrs Conference wiTT consist of 3 days 0. deTibera ti cns and additionaTTy participants wiTT be ab.e to travei to Ma: mbu and Dakawa compiexes to see first hand the ANCs exiie sett7emehts and their needs.

The preparatory work is being conducted by 3 Preparatory Committees in Tanzania, South Africa and Zambia with fuii time Secretariats working in these countries. The preparatory wcrL wiTT inciude holding 14 RegionaT Workshops in South Africa any a NationaT one day Workshop in Johannesburg in December , 1T90 to be attended by 7 deTegates from outside South Africa. Representativesof donor/governmentaT organisationsvnTT be as ked to pay their own travel,accommodation etc costs. The ANC however has to meet the costs of the conference itseTf, the preparatory work and the traveT and accommodation costs of the ANC/MDM deiegation.

Please confirm as soon as possible how many donor representatives Will attend from your region, so that hotel reservations can be made. Note, however, that donors W111 bear the full cost of their participation. They shall be requested to make their travel reservations in good time.

Prior to the Donors Conference, Tuesday 29 January to Friday ist February, and again after the Donors Conference, on February 6 and 7, Donors Representatives will be abie to visit Mazimbu and Dakawa. Those wishing to do so should make flight reservations accordingiy.

A questionnaire will be sent to donors shortly to eiicit information about arrivai/departure dates, the need for transdort to Mazimbu/Dakawa and so op.
