- 1. Mr. Vigtel welcomed the two delegations.
- 2. In his introduction, Mr. Wivegh said that a sound basis of cooperation had been established between the ANC and NPA over the last 11 years and NPA is keen to increase and strengthen its support. To counter the destabilisation of Front-Line States by the South African regime, NPA had increased its

- . support to Angola, Mocambique and other Front-Line countries.

 To be given responsibility as executing agent by the Norwegian

 Government was an honour for NPA.
- 3. Cde Thomas Nkobi, commended NPA for its long-standing bilateral support to the ANC, especially at Viana. Now with its appointment as executing agent a new dimension has been introduced, signifying confidence and trust by the Norwegian Government in NPA. From this new relationship the ANC hoped to receive not just help with the physical development of its projects but also administrative and management training.
 - 4. Re ANC acknowledged formal receipt of and commended the Agreement between the Royal Norwegian Government and NPA,
 - 5. In reviewing the <u>draft Agreement between the ANC and NPA</u>, the following points and queries were raised and amendments recommended:
 - 5.1 With reference to the Preamble, does the scope of NPA*s executing function extend beyond the ANC Projects and Procument in Tanzania? This matter will be put to to-morrow's session when the Ministry of Foreign Affairs will be represented.
 - 5.2 Bilateral assistance between NPA and the ANC will in no way be affected by the newly-established relationship.
 - 5.3 Proposed amendment of Item 1.2 of the Agreement:
 "The ANC will be responsible for the practical implementation of projects in Mazimbu and Dakawa and for general policy concerning projects and procurement."
 - 5.4. Item 1.5 to read:

"The ANC is to assist in providing the necessary clearance of NPA personnel to work in Tanzania from the relevant Tanzanian authorities."

- 5.5 Item 1.6 to read:
 - "As NPA is not registered as an organisation in Tanzania, the NPA operation office will work under the auspices of the ANC temporarily, pending the registration of the NPA by the Government of Tanzania."

 Item 2.1 to read:
- "To work out and set up an annual budget in cosultation with the ANC."
- Item 2.2 to read:
 "To work out a time schedule for the execution of the projects

and procurements in cosultation with the ANC."

- 5.8 Item 2.4 to have added to it:
 - "NPA shall also ensure that consultants and contractors attend all regular site meetings at which both NPA and ANC representatives are present."
- 5.9 Proposed that a new item numbered 2.7 be incorporated in the Agreement, to read:
 - "Copies of relevant financial statements, audited accounts and reports submitted to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs shall also be made available to the ANC."
- NPA has had consultation with NORPLAN over its continued involvement. The ANC stressed the need for continuity in the development of its projects although it does not wish to be bound to one consultant. The principle of freedom to select other consultants was accepted.
- 6. Briefings were given on the projects at Mazimbu and Dakawa and on the Educational Support received during 1987.
- Cost of NORPLAN coordination with VTC Committee to be deferred to to-morrow.
- 8. Proposed that a planning meeting between ANC/NPA is necessary as soon as possible.
- For ongoing coordination it was proposed that consultations should take place in May and September between ANC/NPA and quarterly on-the-ground meetings in Tanzania between the relevant personnel.
- NPA will appoint a project officer in Oslo and Abdelkader Mekki will be NPA's Project Manager in Dar es Salaam.
- 11 Budget Reviews
- 11.1 NORPLAN's Progress Report which incorporates a financial review as at 1/10/87 gives a breakdown of funds utilised and committed but there is a need for a more definitive account of figures.
- 11.2 The Budget Priorities for 1988 are appended.
